**ITEM 1: Approve minutes from meeting held on Thursday; October 7, 2010**

Motion to approve the minutes of the meeting was made by Jim Mitchell, seconded by Hilda Easley and carried a vote of 4: 0.

Richard Wagner abstained the minutes from last month's meeting.

**ITEM 2: Proposed Fixed Route Modifications – Brett Lawler, Fixed Route Supervisor**

Brett Lawler spoke about some of the updates on the proposed changes in the fixed route service for all the routes. There were handouts given to the panel illustrating the proposed changes. Brett reflected on some of the positive feedback the Department has been given about some of the proposed changes.

**ITEM 3: Bus Bench Project – Tony Luangraj, Transportation Planner**

Tony Luangraj discussed the updates on the new bus bench project. There would be approximately 180 bus benches placed in the City for the Fixed Route Service. Tony answered questions from Jim Mitchell regarding the benches around the medical areas of Amarillo.

**ITEM 4: Bus Stop Construction Project – Isaac Rangel, Engineering Assistant**

Isaac Rangel answered more questions regarding bus bench construction. There were a couple of commonly used bus stops that didn't have enough right of way to insert a bench. Isaac discussed the legal process of trying to obtain enough right of way in effort to place a bus bench at a commonly used bus stop.
