ITEM 1: Approve minutes from meeting held on Thursday; August 2, 2012

Motion to approve the minutes of the meeting was made by Richard Wagner, seconded by Hilda Easley and carried a vote of 5: 0. It was unanimous.

ITEM 2: Present revisions on the Pictograph Map Legend.

Jenifer Ledbetter talked about the Pictograph map legend and the changes that were requested. Most of the corresponding bus stops have been labeled in the legend; however, some of the local sites were not on the bus route itself but still seemed pertinent so those were not changed on the legend. Ms. Ledbetter went on to state that the pictograph maps, brochures, and LEP maps had been given to Transit employees for their input with much success.

ITEM 3: Discuss the updates for Phase IV for the Bus Stop Improvement Project.

Isaac Rangel from the Engineering Department informed the board an update on Phase IV. Phase IV plans are finalized including 29 bus benches, 7 new shelters, and 1 new shelter location. The Engineering Department is still pursuing four temporary construction easements, but still plans to begin the specs for Phase IV. The estimated cost for Phase IV is \$520,845. The TDLR inspection for Phase II is still pending, and Cruz Construction has 60-90 days to respond. The TDLR inspection for Phase III is completed and in compliance.

ITEM 4: Announcements

The Board was advised that changes to the Title VI were coming, and that Transit had received Chapter 1 of 12 of the Title VI changes. Transit had also received the changes to the Limited English Proficiency program where FTA made the stipulation that any language with a population of 1,000 who speak English "less than well" need to have all Transit documents translated to that language. The only other one, besides Spanish, is Vietnamese. Ms. Ledbetter stated the changes and maps will be presented at a later meeting when completed.
