INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Board Member Rogers gave the invocation, and Vice Chairman Downey led the Pledge of Allegiance.

ITEM 1: Call to Order.

Chairman Kelley established a quorum and called the regularly scheduled meeting of the Traffic Advisory Board to order at 1:30 p.m.

ITEM 2: Approval of Minutes from the Regular Meeting held on February 18, 2015.

Board Member Richardson requested the minutes be amended to reflect that she was absent at the February 18, 2015, meeting. Motion was made by Vice Chairman Downey and seconded by Board Member Richardson, and motion unanimously carried to approve such minutes as amended.

ITEM 3: Consider a Two-Hour Parking Restriction on the West Side of the 800 Block of S. Polk Street.

Jerry Bird, Traffic Engineer, stated that the Traffic Engineering Department had received a request to change the one-hour parking restriction on the west side of the 800 block of S. Polk


Street to a two-hour parking restriction. Motion was made by Board Member Rogers and seconded by Board Member Nelson, and motion unanimously carried to recommend the parking restriction be changed as presented.

ITEM 4: Public Forum.

Board Member Graham reported that the Adventure Cycling Association will sponsor Bicycle Route 66 rides from Chicago, Illinois, to Santa Monica, California beginning in 2016. He stated that Amarillo is on the Section 3 segment of the route, which begins in Joplin, Missouri, and ends in Adrian, Texas. He provided maps of the route.
