Kelley Shaw, Planning Director, opened the meeting and established a quorum of the Parks and Recreation Board, Planning and Zoning Commission, and the Traffic Advisory Board.

ITEM 1: Presentation and discussion of the proposed Rock Island Rail Trail Master Plan

Mr. Shaw stated that a subcommittee was originated to create a long-range comprehensive Master Plan for the implementation of the proposed Phase II Rock Island Rail Trail (RIRT) Master Plan. Mr. Shaw explained the goals and objectives, existing conditions, and possible solutions/alternatives to be presented to the City Council for action. Possible funding for the improvements includes the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Grant.

The board members and city staff discussed possible connectivity, aesthetics, amenities and accessibility from neighborhoods. Concerns mentioned were safety issues at major intersections, costs associated with implementing the plan, parking issues, and signage.

Mr. Shaw concluded the RIRT is a great asset of Amarillo, and City staff and the subcommittee members feel now is the time to further enhance the trail.

ITEM 2: Comments from interested citizens on matters directly pertaining to the Rock Island Rail Trail

No comments from the general public.

ITEM 3: Consideration of the Rock Island Rail Trail Master Plan by each Board and Commission

Motion was made from the Parks and Recreation Board, by Board Member Payne, seconded by Board Member Easterling, and unanimously carried to endorse the Rock Island Rail Trail Master Plan.

Motion was made from the Planning and Zoning Commission, by Commissioner Good, seconded by Commissioner Smith, and unanimously carried to endorse the Rock Island Rail Trail Master Plan.

Motion was made from the Traffic Advisory Board, by Board Member Richardson, seconded by Board Member Rogers, and unanimously carried to endorse the Rock Island Rail Trail Master Plan.
