

RESOLUTION NO. 05-19-15- 1

A RESOLUTION CANVASSING THE RETURNS AND DECLARING THE RESULTS FOR THE REGULAR ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF AMARILLO ON THE 9TH DAY OF MAY 2015 FOR CITY OFFICES; ORDERING THE RUN-OFF ELECTION OF THE CITY OF AMARILLO TO BE CONDUCTED ON THE 13TH DAY OF JUNE, 2015 IN THE CITY OF AMARILLO, TEXAS; DESIGNATING POLLING PLACES; AND PROVIDING FOR THE CONDUCT OF SUCH ELECTION.

WHEREAS, on this the 19th day of May, 2015, came on to be considered by the City Council the canvass of the returns of the City Officers Election held in the City of Amarillo on the 9th day of May, 2015, for the purpose of electing a Mayor, Councilmember, Place No. 1; Councilmember, Place No. 2; Councilmember, Place No. 3; Councilmember, Place No. 4; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has canvassed the returns of said election and it appears from said returns, duly and legally made, that there were 15,963 valid and legal ballots cast in said election; and that each of the candidates in said election received the following votes:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AMARILLO, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That said election was duly called; that notice of said election was given and held in accordance with law; and that said election and the returns thereof have been duly canvassed by the City Council.

SECTION 2. That at said election:

- A. Paul Harpole received a majority of the votes cast for the office of Mayor and was duly elected Mayor of the City of Amarillo.
- B. Elisha L. Demerson received a majority of the votes cast for and was duly elected as Councilmember, Place No. 1.
- C. Brian Eades received a majority of the votes cast for and was duly elected as Councilmember, Place No. 2.
- D. Randy Burkett received a majority of the votes cast for and was duly elected as Councilmember, Place No. 3.
- E. No candidate received a majority of the votes cast for and was duly elected as Council Councilmember, Place No. 4.

SECTION 3. That because no candidate received a majority of all votes cast for the office of Councilmember, Place No. 4, a run-off is hereby declared necessary and is called to be held on June 13, 2015, between the two candidates receiving the most votes for such office:

SECTION 4. The City of Amarillo has a contract for the election services with the County Election Administrators of both Potter and Randall Counties, Texas and authorize them to conduct and supervise the necessary duties of the run-off election.

SECTION 5. The early voting polling places and vote centers for the June 13, 2015 run-off election shall be conducted at: Potter County -- Santa Fe Building, 900 South Polk Street, and Randall County -- Randall County Annex, 4111 South Georgia in the City of Amarillo, Texas. Early voting will begin on Monday, June 1 through Friday, June 5, 2015, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. through 5:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. through 7:00 p.m. on June 8 and 9, 2015 each day. On the run-off election day, June 13, 2015, the voting polling places and vote centers hours will be 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. and shall be conducted at:




