Item 6: Topical Disease Update

Dr. Milton, Health Authority, Public Health, City of Amarillo discussed influenza activity.

- 27% of the patients admitted at Northwest were flu positive
- Employees asked to wear a mask

- Predominant Influenza A (H3N2)
- Flu vaccine is still recommended by the CDC
- Flu vaccine is 30% to 40% effective

Shaun May, Director of Environmental Health presented the department's report.

- Anthony Spanel, Health Inspector, Environmental Health, City of Amarillo
 - o 7yrs with the City of Amarillo
 - o Promoted last year to a supervisor
 - o Supervises food operations
 - o 1,620 food establishments that are regulated
 - o 1,500 temporary food permits every year
 - o Working on Accreditation through the FDA
 - Currently have 8 full-time food sanitarians
 - o Should have 17 full-time inspectors

- New software in Environmental Health
 - o Specifically designed for environmental health
 - o \$100,000.00 budget for the software

Public Health

Casie Stoughton, Director of Public Health, presented the Public Health report. (Attached)

- New grants
 - o Hansen's Grant
 - \$18,500 to take care of patients with Hansen's disease. Healthy Texas
 Babies
 - o Healthy Texas Babies Grant
 - 5 year grant (base of \$67,500 annually) with DSHS to coordinate the Healthy Texas Babies Community Coalition initiative and collaborate with community partners and stakeholders to strengthen local capacity and community partnerships to improve birth outcomes and reduce disparities in infant mortality rates towards achievement of Healthy People 2020 goals, in Potter and Randall Counties.
 - o Community and Clinical Health Bridge Grant
 - 5 year grant (\$250,000 annually) with DSHS to reduce obesity and related chronic health conditions in Potter and Randall Counties.
 - Grant will allow additional staff members
 - Partner with Heal the City

WIC

Margaret Payton, Director, WIC, City of Amarillo, presented the department's report. (Attached)

- Three month WIC participation report (October, November, December)
- Lost \$2,500.00 in the month of December
- Shortage on clerks
- Decline on case load
 - o Decline in birth rate
 - Small increase in wages and bonuses
 - o 20% of case load were Refugee clients and it has dropped to 2%
- Decline with funding
- New computer system funding
- State funding
