Presentation of proposed changes to Chapter 8-2 Animals and Fowl Ordinances. Richard Havens presented a draft version before continuing on with public engagement. The goals to accomplish are to strengthen existing ordinances; control the animal population, attempt to alleviate shelter population congestion, give animals a better fighting chance through adoptions and rescues, remove barriers to positive outcomes, and lower risk of illness. # **ITEM 2:** Public Hearing:

Lisa Nicholson, 3505 Fleetwood Drive, 79109. She is aware of the animal overpopulation. She does not feel ordinance changes will affect back yard breeders. She does not agree with decreased time from 72 hours to 48 hours. Her concern is for individuals that do not have computers to be able to look for their lost animals.

Jenny Chism, 9200 Town Square, 79119. She does not agree with the stray hold period being shortened from 72 hours to 48 hours. Agrees with the Ninety Four Ninety program.

Mandy Keeler, 2823 Armand, 79110. Rescue Assistant for APHS. She is in total support of the proposed ordinance changes presented by AM&W.

Cecily Chase Steinmetz, 4401 S. Coulter, 79109. Rescue Coordinator at APHS. She is in total support of the proposed ordinance changes. In support of shortening stray hold to 48 hours from 72 hours.

John Spydell, 14200 Sundown Trall, 79118. He feels that breeders are being targeted. Responsible people are going to do the right thing. He feels that the wrong group is being targeted. Does not know how the enforcement part of these ordinances will happen.

Jaclyn Spydell, 14200 Sundown Trail, 79118. They are not new to adopting. They are responsible breeders of English Mastiffs. She feels like they are being punished for being breeders. AM&W department needs to go and target irresponsible breeders. Breeders should be able to sale their dogs anywhere they want to.

Andrea Gulley, 3533 Sleepy Hollow Blvd, 79121. Thank you to Richard for working on the ordinance. She totally supports the changes. She mentioned a couple of changes to some ordinances.

8-2-53 - failure to reclaim should be one business day to pickup animal in fairness to the public.

8-2-59 - mandatory spay/neuter, is perfectly reasonable to require animal picked up to be spay/neuter

8-2-16 – intact dogs and cats at large-tattooing is wonderful way to be able to identify if an animal is spayed or neutered. She is in favor for the 48 hour stray hold period.

ITEM 4: Update on APHS "90-Four-90" Plan by Larry Milam.

Met with mayor and city manager and the discussion brought a change where the "Opt- Out" funding would not be supported. The City would support an "Opt-In" option. The program would change to "9 four 90", where it would only take 9% of people within the city to fund \$90.00 per year in order to be successful in the proposal (7000 people contributing). The plan will be revised to have the opt-in option versus the opt-out option. It would take 25 months before Clinic can be built from time of proposal passing and once passed the clinic would conduct 3000 surgeries per year. This would ensure that 90% of animals meet the live release rate criteria within the community.
