Mayor Nelson established a quorum, called the meeting to order, welcomed those in attendance and the following items of business were conducted:

Two key pieces of equipment utilized in the sealcoat process are the chipspreader and pneumatic roller. For the past eight years, the Street Division has leased a chipspeader and two 25-ton rollers for the summer sealcoat program. The leased chipspreader serves as a backup to the City owned chipspreader to prevent the city from losing valuable hours, or even days, of operation due to equipment malfunctions. The two leased rollers, which are significantly larger than the City owned rollers, provide quicker compaction and better adhesion of the rock to the street surface.

ORDINANCE NO. 7733

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF AMARILLO, TEXAS AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 4969 TO CORRECT A CLERICAL ERROR RELATING TO THE LEGAL DESCRIPTION OF AN ALLEY BEING VACATED AND ABANDONED; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on or about February 26, 1980 the Amarillo City Council passed Ordinance 4969 determining a lack of public necessity and purpose for streets and alleys in the vicinity of I-40 and Eastern in Amarillo, Potter County, Texas and vacating and abandoning said streets and alleys; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 4969 was filed of record in the Official Public Records of Potter County, Texas, Instrument Number. 501784 on February 29, 1980; and

WHEREAS, the legal location of the streets and alleys set forth in Section 1 of Ordinance 4969 erroneously states that the alley to be vacated is in Sunrise Addition, Unit 3; all in Section 123, Block 2, A.B.&M. Survey, Potter County, Texas whereas in fact the vacation of said alley is located in Sunrise Addition, Unit 2; all in Section 123, Block 2, A.B.&M. Survey, Potter County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the Amarillo City Council has determined that the erroneous location set forth in Ordinance 4969 was the result of a clerical error;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AMARILLO, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance 4969 is hereby amended by changing said documents to reflect that the location of the alley in Sunrise Addition, Unit 2; all in Section 123, Block 2, A.B.&M Survey, Potter County, Texas and not in Sunrise Addition, Unit 3; all in Section 123, Block 2, A.B.&M Survey, Potter County, Texas.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance is being passed for the sole purpose of correcting a clerical error made in Section 1 of No. 4969 which Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect save and except as corrected by this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its second and final reading

Consider Award—Contract Agreement to augment alley cleanup activities. Award to: Republic Services, Inc. -- \$250,000.00

Agenda Item Summary

This Professional Services Agreement provides for solid waste collection and disposal services of bulky items and brush in the city.

Requested Action

Approval of Professional Services Agreement in the amount of \$250,000 for solid waste collection and disposal of bulky items and brush in the city.

Funding Summary

Funds are currently available within the Solid Waste Collection Professional Services Account, 1431.62000 in the amount of \$250,000

Community Engagement Summary

This item is a pilot program operation to assist in the solid waste collection and disposal of bulky items and brush in the city. It is anticipated that community feedback will be sought upon completion of the program.

Staff Recommendation

City Staff recommends approval of the Professional Services Agreement for Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Services to Republic Services, Inc. in the amount of \$250,000 based on the results from RFP P10-18.

BULK WASTE AGREEMENT

THIS BULK WASTE AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is entered into on, 2018 between the City of Amarillo, Texas (the "City"), and BFI Waste Services of Texas, LP, d/b/a Republic Services of ("Republic").
A. The City desires to procure certain Waste Material collection and disposal services to assist the City with its own bulk waste program.
B. Republic agrees to collect and dispose of the Waste Materials on the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.
NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises of the parties and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:
1. <u>Definitions</u> . Capitalized terms used in this Agreement and not otherwise defined shall have the following meanings:
(a) "Applicable Laws" means applicable federal, state or local laws or regulations.
(b) "Bulky Waste" means furniture and other similar items with weights or volumes greater than those allowed for typical waste bins or containers.
(c) "Excluded Waste" means (i) any hazardous materials, wastes or substances; toxic substances, wastes or pollutants; contaminants; pollutants; infectious wastes; medical wastes; or radioactive wastes, each as defined by Applicable Laws; (ii) any materials that would damage Republic's collection equipment, as determined by Republic in its sole discretion; and (iii) cross ties, tires, solvents, paint, petroleum products, pool chemicals, fertilizer, herbicides, pesticides, logs or stumps, car batteries, soil, rocks, concrete, medical waste, medical sharps and closed containers.
(d) "Waste Materials" means non-hazardous Bulky Waste and White Goods, excluding Excluded Waste.
(e) "White Goods" means refrigerators, air conditioners, freezers or items that with all CFC's (Freon), removed by a licensed.
2. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Agreement shall commence on, 2018 (the "Effective Date") and continue for 1 year, unless either party provides at least 30 days' prior written notice to the other party of its desire not to continue the Agreement to the other party (the "Term").
3. Rates. Republic shall charge the City the rates set forth on Exhibit A (the "Rates"). Republic shall provide a monthly invoice to the City, and the City shall pay within 30 days of receipt of such invoices. If this Agreement continues for more than one year after the Effective Date, then Republic

may increase the Rates in an amount equal to the percentage increases in the Consumer Price Index for All

Urban Consumers (Water, Sewer and Trash Collection Services) U.S. City Average, as published by United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Statistics (the "CPI"). Rates will be increased using the most recently available trailing 12 months average CPI compared to the 12 months preceding. No decreases

shall be made to the rates for service if the CPI decreases.

- 4. <u>Title</u>. Republic shall acquire title to Waste Materials when placed in Contractor's vehicle. Title to and liability for any Excluded Waste shall remain with the generator and shall at no time pass to Republic.
- 5. <u>Excused Performance</u>. Except for the City's obligation to pay amounts due to Republic any failure or delay in performance due to contingencies beyond a party's reasonable control, including riots, terrorist acts, compliance with Applicable Laws or governmental orders, fires and acts of God, shall not constitute a breach of this Agreement.
- 6. <u>Damage to Property</u>. Contractor shall not be responsible for any damages to City's property or equipment located adjacent to the collection receptacles, nor to City's pavement, curbing or other driving surfaces resulting from Contractor's providing the services under this Contract.
- Miscellaneous. This Agreement sets forth the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes all prior agreements, whether written or oral, that exist between the parties regarding the subject matter of this Agreement. Republic shall have no confidentiality obligation with respect to any Waste Materials, but shall not intentionally promote, exploit or publicize any information contained therein or related thereto, including the existence of an agreement between the parties. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure solely to the benefit of the parties and their permitted assigns. If any provision of this Agreement shall be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, it shall be modified so as to be valid, legal and enforceable but so as most nearly to retain the intent of the parties. If such modification is not possible, such provision shall be severed from this Agreement. In either case, the validity, legality, and enforceability of the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall not in any way be affected thereby. The City and Republic agree that this Agreement may be signed in counterparts, which together shall constitute a single document, and that electronic signatures are valid and effective, and that an electronically stored copy of this Agreement constitutes proof of the signature and contents of this Agreement, as though it were an original. The laws of the State of Texas shall govern any dispute under this Agreement.

In witness whereof, the parties have entered into this Agreement as of the Effective Date.
