The invocation was given by Sean Vokes, Hilliside Christian Church. Mayor Pro Tem Nair led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comment:

Mayor Pro Tem Nair established a guorum called the meeting to order, welcomed those in attendance and the following items of business were conducted:

Edith DiTommaso, 1633 Bowie Street, #B proposed that the Amarillo Police Officers not participate in immigration arrests. Lewis Arthur, 1000 Southwest 10th Avenue (parking lot), stated he was on a nationwide search and rescue for Homeless Veterans. He stated he had an unlimited arrount of resources and operated under the Good Samaritan law James Schenck, 6216 Camsborough Street, stated the early public comment benod limits citizen attendance and the need to be sensitive and diplomatic. He further inquired about the economic development feasibility study. Mr. Cowell states the strategic plants first priefing will occur on March 7. The timeline states a public meeting at the end of March, and drafts are due late April or first of May. Kit Rudd, 6850 Grande Street, stated he hoped the upcoming election was a clean campaign and run in a positive manner. There were no further comments.

<u>ITEM 1</u>: Mayor Ro Tem Nair presented the minutes for February 14, 2017. Motion was made by Councilmember Demerson to approve the minutes, seconded by Councilmember Blake, and unanimously carried to approve the minutes.

ITEM 2: Mayor Pro Tem Nair opened the public hearing. Sara Black, 3211 South Coulter Street, stated she and her husband, who was a registered pharmacist, owned the Class A Pharmacy, which has evolved into a health food store. Shaun May, Director of Environmental Health, stated notice was given in January 2016 of the required three-compartment sink and other equipment that did not meet the commercial grade requirements. Mr. Miller stated Mr. May has given Ms. Black adequate time to make the changes and the time expires today. The restaurant remains in violation of the City ordinance. Mr. May stated on the original approval, there was a three-compartment sink. On the annual permits submitted a box was checked that stated there were no changes. The current sinks are not a commercial grade nor are they deep enough. Councilmember Demerson inquired if there were notations made by public health staff concerning the sink compartments. Mr. May replied he could find no official record.

Ms. Black stated they use dishwashing liquid and Clorox and are very limited as to what they wash. Mr. May stressed the importance of a three-compartment sink was to protect

public health. Mr. McKamie stated this was an unusual appeal proceeding. It did not solicit public comment and he recommend Council not accept public comment. Chapter 8 states a person my give notice to the City Secretary, and Council will hear the matter on its next available agenda. Council will decide to set aside or sustain the decision. Mayor Pro Tem Nair stated this was not an issue of sanitation but of state law. Mr. McKamie stated the establishment may not operate during an appeal. Ms. Black stated she would give up her larger pots if they allow her to use the two-compartment sink. Mr. May replied it was a fundamental issue to food safety. Motion was made by Councilmember Demerson to sustain staff's recommendation, seconded by Councilmember Blake.

Voting AYE were Mayor Pro Tem Nair, Councilmembers Blake and Demerson; voting NO was Councilmember Burkett; the motion carried by a 3:1 vote of the Council.

ITEM 3: Mr. Miller stated this item was to receive and accept the City of Amarillo's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for the year ending September 30, 2016. Michelle Bonner, Assistant City Manager, thanked Laura Storrs and her staff and introduced Janie Arnold, Connor, McMillon, Mitchell and Shennum, who performed the City's audit. Ms. Bonner addressed the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report. She stated the City has received for 35 years the Certificate Actievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting. She stated the opinion was clean the single audit contained two opinions for internal controls which there were no findings of noncompliant, and a report on major programs, federal and state programs. The audit is unmodified and a clean report. Motion was made by Councilmember Burkett to accept the audit, seconded by Councilmember Demerson.

Voting AYE were Mayor Pro Tem Nair, Council pembers Blake, Demerson and Burkett; voting NO were none; the motion carried by 4:0 vote of the Council.

Resolution - Four-Way Stop at Sandie Drive & Hatfield Circle.

Agenda Item Summary

This is a resolution for placement of a 4-way stop at the intersection of Sandie and Hatfield. For clarification, this is the second intersection west of Danbury on Sandie. Residents on Sandie Drive presented a petition for a 4-way stop for the purpose of speed control on Sandie. The Traffic Advisory Board heard this request at their February 15 meeting. The Board voted 4-0 to recommend to the City Council that a 4-way stop be placed at Sandie and Hatfield.

Requested Action

Requesting Council consider placement of a 4-way stop at the intersection of Sandie & Hatfield.

Funding Summary

N/A

Community Engagement Summary

Petition was signed by 70 percent of residents along the affected street. All property owners within 1000 feet of the proposed 4-way stop intersection were notified (by letter) of the Traffic Advisory Board meeting. A total of 11 responses were received by Staff. Seven were in favor of the proposal, three were against, and one had no opinion.

Staff Recommendation

Traffic Engineering Department conducted a four-way stop warrant study for Sandie & Hatfield. No warrants were met for placement of a 4-way stop.

SUBJECT: Four-Way Stop: Sandie & Hatfield Circle


The Traffic Engineering Department received a request from Nathan Pike, 6510 Sandie, to consider placement of a four-way stop at the intersection of Sandie and Hatfield Circle. The request was made as a way to control traffic speeds on Sandie. The existing intersection stop signs are placed north-south on Hatfield, which is the lower-volume street.


Sandie is a residential collector street that carries approximately 1900 vehicles per day. Hatfield carries approximately 300 vehicles per day. There have been no reported traffic collisions at this location in the last three years. The 85th percentile speed on Sandie is 35MPH. This means that 85 percent of the drivers on Sandie are travelling at or below 35 miles per hour. The existing speed limit is 30.


The Traffic Engineering Department conducted a study to determine if a 4-way stop is warranted. The study indicated that none of the warrants for 4-way stop control as described in the Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, Section 2B.07 Multi-Way Stop Applications were met. Please see the attached copy.

As a result of the study findings and in accordance with the Neighborhood Traffic Assistance Program procedures, Mr. Pike has presented a petition signed by other property owners along Sandie Drive, to request a hearing before the Amarillo Traffic Advisory Board.

The Traffic Engineering Department has no recommendation with regard to this request.







Section 2B.07 Multi-Way Stop Applications

Support:

- Multi-way stop control can be useful as a safety measure at intersections if certain traffic conditions exist. Safety concerns associated with multi-way stops include pedestrians, bicyclists, and all road users expecting other road users to stop. Multi-way stop control is used where the volume of traffic on the intersecting roads is
- The restrictions on the use of STOP signs described in Section 2B.04 also apply to multi-way stop applications.

Guidance:

- The decision to install multi-way stop control should be based on an engineering study. 03
- The following criteria should be considered in the engineering study for a multi-way STOP sign installation: 04
 - A. Where traffic control signals are justified, the multi-way stop is an interim measure that can be installed quickly to control traffic while arrangements are being made for the installation of the traffic control signal.
 - B. Five or more reported crashes in a 12-month period that are susceptible to correction by a multi-way stop installation. Such crashes include right-turn and left-turn collisions as well as right-angle collisions.
 - C. Minimum volumes:
 - 1. The vehicular volume entering the intersection from the major street approaches (total of both
 - approaches) averages at least 300 vehicles per hour for any 8 hours of an average day; and The combined vehicular, pedestrian, and bicycle volume entering the intersection from the minor street approaches (total of both approaches) averages at least 200 units per hour for the same 8 hours, with an average delay to minor-street vehicular traffic of at least 30 seconds per vehicle during the highest hour; but
 - If the 85th-percentile approach speed of the major-street traffic exceeds 40 mph, the minimum vehicular volume warrants are 70 percent of the values provided in Items 1 and 2.
 - D. Where no single criterion is satisfied, but where Criteria B, C.1, and C.2 are all satisfied to 80 percent of the minimum values. Criterion C.3 is excluded from this condition.

Option:

- Other criteria that may be considered in an engineering study include: 05
 - A. The need to control left-turn conflicts;
 - The need to control vehicle/pedestrian conflicts near locations that generate high pedestrian volumes;
