The invocation was given by Alan Abraham. Mayor Harpole led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Harpole established a quorum, called the meeting to order, welcomed those in attendance and the following items of business were conducted:

Mr. Childers introduced new City appointments and Division Directors: Bob Cowell, Deputy City Manager, William M. McKamie, City Attorney, Floyd Hartman, Director of Capital Projects and Development Engineering, Rich Gagnon, Information Technology Director, and Scott McDonald, Director of Community Safety and Regulatory Services.

There was a presentation to Amanda Barrera, Director of Library Services for an Achievement of Library Excellence Award.

<u>ITEM 1</u>: Mayor Harpole presented the minutes for January 26, 2016. Motion was made by Councilmember Burkett to approve the minutes; motion was seconded by Councilmember Demerson, and unanimously carried to approve the minutes.

ITEM 2: Mayor Harpole presented an ordinance rezoning Lots 11 and 12, Edgefield Addition, in Section 171, Block 3, AB&M Survey, Randall County, to change from Residential District 3 to Office District 1, in the vicinity of 34th Avenue and South Polk Street. It is recommended for approval by a 6:0 vote of the Planning and Zoning Commission. Motion was made by Councilmember Eades, seconded by Councilmember Demerson, that the following captioned ordinance be passed on first reading:

Motion was made by Councilmember Demerson to table this item until next week, seconded by Councilmember Burkett:

Randy Schuster, Deputy Building Official, Barbara French, Mr. Roberts and spouse, and Hector Mendoza, were sworn in. Mr. Schuster stated there have been no recent applications for permits to abate the nuisance at the property at 402 South Tennessee Street. The property was originally posted with a condemnation placard on January 13, 2016. The police have been called to this property four times. The property is a nuisance to the community and creates an unsafe environment. There are \$3,443.40 in delinquent and \$586.00 in current taxes due on the property. There is also \$682.17 owed to the City against this property for previous mowing and cleanup. There has been no water service since February 2010. Mayor Harpole asked if there was an owner, property owner or neighbor in attendance. There were none.

Barbara French, 404 South Tennessee Street, lives next door to this house. She stated people were gaining access through open windows. Mr. and Mrs. Roberts, 504 South Collins, Tulia, stated they wanted to purchase the house. Damon Pearson, 713 Southwest 9th Avenue, stated he would also like to purchase this residence.

Councilmember Demerson inquired if the entire structure was unsafe. Mr. Schuster replied that the building is structurally severely damaged and is dangerous. Councilmember Burkett inquired if this item could be tabled for a week. Mayor Harpole stated he was concerned about the neighbor's complaints. Councilmember Demerson also asked for the opportunity to explore if the structure could be rehabilitated. Mr. McKamie suggested closing the hearing and the evidence and a motion be made to table this item for the next meeting or a date certain.

Mayor Harpole closed the hearing.

Voting AYE were Councilmembers Demerson, Eades and Burkett; Voting NO were Mayor Harpole; the motion carried by a 3:1 vote of the Council.

Randy Schuster, Deputy Building Official, and Jimmy Ontiveros, were sworn in. Mr. Schuster stated there have been no recent applications for permits to abate the nuisance at the property at 3909 Southeast 12th Avenue. The property was originally posted with a condemnation placard on January 13, 2016. The property is a nuisance to the community and creates an unsafe environment. There are \$1,612.01 in delinquent and \$545.02 in current taxes due on the property. There is also \$810.20 owed to the City against this property for previous mowing and cleanup. There has been no water service since February 2010. Mayor Harpole asked if there was an owner, property owner or neighbor in attendance. There were none.

Jimmy Ontiveros, 2112 South Fairfield Street, inquired as to how much it would cost to demolition the residence. Mr. Schuster replied he would not know until it was put out for bid or Mr. Ontiveros could tear it down himself with the proper demolition permits.

Mayor Harpole closed the hearing.

ITEM 10: Mr. Childers stated this item was pulled from the agenda (113 Southeast 12th Avenue).

ITEM 12: Mayor Harpole presented the consent agenda and asked if any item should be removed for discussion or separate consideration. There were none. Motion was made by Councilmember Burkett to approve the consent agenda and authorizes the City Manager to execute all documents necessary for each transaction. Motion was seconded by Councilmember Demerson.

This item is the scheduled replacement of heavy trucks that have reached or exceeded usable life and additional equipment approved in the 2015-2016 budget. The award consists of heavy trucks that will be used by the following departments: Water Distribution, Drainage Utility, Solid Waste Collection, Park Maintenance, and Street Department. This bid represents an overall 8% increase from the last purchase. Funding for this award is available in the approved FY 2015-2016 Municipal Garage Rolling Stock Budget.

This item approves Change Order No. 3 to the contract with Holmes Construction Company LP for work performed on the rehabilitation of Southwest 9th Avenue from Coulter Street to Amarillo Boulevard. The change order is to pay for repair work to the roadway that became necessary to relocate an unidentified gas line. Funding for this change order is available in the approved Engineering Department Capital Improvements Program.

D. <u>Approval – Change Order No. 1 – Storm Sewer in Hillside Road from</u> Soncy Road to Helium Road:

This item approves Change Order No. 1 to the contract with Williams Ditching LLC for work performed on the storm sewer in Hillside Road from Hillside Road to Helium Road. The change order is for approval of a cost reduction proposal eliminating the steel casing and PVC gravity flow pipe and replacing them with AWWA C905 restrained joint PVC pipe. Contractor will be paid 50% of the cost savings \$39,152.20 upon completion of the associated items.

E. <u>Approval – Professional Services</u>:

This item authorizes the Interim City Manager to enter into an agreement to secure legal representation for the City of Amarillo with William M. McKamie, attorney to serve as City Attorney of Amarillo.

Voting AYE were Mayor Harpole, Councilmembers Demerson, Eades and Burkett; Voting NO were none; the motion carried by a 4:0 vote of the Council.

Mayor Harpole announced that this is the end of the regular agenda, but this time is reserved to hear from any citizen concerning matters pertaining to City policies, programs or services not on today's agenda. The public forum is set under the Open Meetings Act and that during the public forum the City Council can respond with a statement of fact, a statement of City policy or decide whether to place an item on a future agenda.

Allen Finegold, 2601 North Grand Street, stated the City's procedure on condemnations should only deal with the owner or agent and a potential buyer should not be considered. Jesse Pfrimmer, 5723 South Milam Street, complimented the City on the library award. He further stated the condemnation procedures should be considered on taxable properties, and not being condemned on property value. He inquired as to why the various taxing entities do not take houses for not paying back taxes instead of waiting until the structures are deteriorated. James Schenck, 6216 Gainsborough Street, asked how the DAI funds would be spent. He inquired about open spots on the LGC board and need for citizen representative. Mr. Schenck further stated the need to decide about the Type A and Type B issue. There were no further comments.

Mayor Harpole advised that the meeting was adjourned.
