### 1. MINUTES:

Approval of the City Commission minutes of the regular meeting held on April 9, 2013.

### 2. **ORDINANCE NO. 7401:**

This is the first reading of an ordinance changing the zoning of Lot 9-A, Block 55, Olsen Park Unit No. 53, in Section 8, Block 9, BS&F Survey, Potter County, in the vicinity of Interstate 40 and Hancock Street from Planned Development District 160 to Amended Planned Development District for expansion of existing office uses. This is recommended for approval by a 5:0:1 vote of the Planning and Zoning Commission.

#### 3. **ORDINANCE NO. 7402:**

This is the first reading of an ordinance changing the zoning of Lot 10, Block 25, Oak Dale Unit No. 3, in Section 122, Block 2, AB&M Survey, Randall County, in the vicinity of Ricks Street and Southeast 33rd Avenue from Residential District 1 to Residential District 1 with a specific use permit for placement of a carport within the front yard setback. This is recommended for approval by a 6:0 vote of the Planning and Zoning Commission.

## 4. **CONSENT AGENDA:**

It is recommended that the following items be approved and that the City Manager be authorized to execute all documents necessary for each transaction:

# A. Purchase – Van and Camera Equipped Van Body:

Awards as follows:

Van -- Caldwell Country Chevrolet -- \$36,335.00 Camera - Equipped Van Body - Cues, Inc. -- \$166,634.58

This item approves the purchase of a van and van body to provide the capability to inspect storm water pipes and other facilities with a remotely operated camera system. Funding for this purchase is from the approved Municipal Garage budget.

# B. <u>Award -- Roof Replacement – Aviation Hangar 3000</u>: Award to lowest responsive bidder: Tecta America CS -- \$634,700.00

This item awards a contract for the replacement of the entire roof and removal of asbestos panels at Hangar 3000 at the Rick Husband International Airport property. The roof received substantial wind damage in 2012. The cost of the project was estimated at \$750,000. The project is approved in the FY 2012/2013 Airport Capital Improvement budget and is largely funded by the City's insurance carrier.

## C. <u>Approval – Texas Traffic Safety Program Grant</u>:

This item authorizes submission of a \$9,000 grant to the Texas Transportation Commission for a "Click it or Ticket" campaign in May and June 2013. The grant will reimburse the Police Department for overtime costs associated with targeted enforcement activities related to seat belts use.

## D. Dedications and Acceptances:

- A 2.46 acre drainage easement in Section 39 Block 9, BS&F Survey, Randall County, in the vicinity of Coulter Street and Bend Drive for Greenways at Hillside Subdivision.
- 2) Dedication of a five foot Xcel Electrical Easement in Section 29, Block 9, BS&F Survey, Randall County, in the vicinity of Southwest 45<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Park Side Drive for the City new fire station.
- 3) Storm Water Drainage Agreement providing exclusive agreement for storm water drainage from Anton Kuster Avenue. Parties: United Supermarket, LLC and the City of Amarillo.
