# 2. <u>PUBLIC HEARING - PROPOSED SEX OFFENDER RESIDENCY</u> ORDINANCE:

This item conducts a public hearing on the proposed sex offender residency restriction ordinance. The proposed ordinance, as currently drafted, would restrict individuals who are required to register on the Texas Sex Offender Database because of certain convictions involving a minor child from establishing residence with 1,000 feet of a licensed Day Care Center or defined Premise where children commonly gather such as schools, parks, public recreation areas and others. This hearing is posted to present information and data regarding the proposal and to solicit and receive input for consideration.

# A. <u>Award – Modular Playground Purchase and Installation:</u>

Award to low responsive bidder on Texas BuyBoard Cooperative Purchasing Contract – Exerplay, Inc.:

South Georgia School Playground \$ 71,069.75

Martin Road Park \$ 82,012.03

Total Award \$153,081.78

This item awards a contract to furnish and install new modular playground equipment at the South Georgia School Park and Martin Road Park. The new equipment for the South Georgia School Park will replace existing equipment that is past its usable lifespan and does not meet current safety standards. This project will include both the installation of the new play structure and new surface material. The new equipment for Martin Road Park will replace the equipment that was destroyed by fire in the early fall of 2011. This project includes the removal of the existing, damaged surface material and installation of new surface material. Both play structures meet all relevant safety requirements and codes. Funding for the South Georgia play structure is in the approved Parks Department Capital Improvement Program budget. Funding for the Martin Road play structure is from the City's Self-Insurance Fund.

This item accepts the 2011 Grant Award for two pass-through programs designed to enhance the provision of emergency management and public safety efforts. The SHSP-LETPA grant is designed to increase radio communication capabilities for the Amarillo Police Department Narcotics and SWAT units. The MMRS grant improves the integration of public health, medical and emergency management capabilities by funding staffing, planning, and equipment purchases through the Amarillo/Potter/Randall Office of Emergency Management.
