Mayor Pro Tem Hays established a quorum, called the meeting to order, welcomed those in attendance and the following items of business were conducted:

PUBLIC COMMENT

James Schenck, 6216 Gainsborough Road, spoke on the meeting times, the number of staff present, and questioned the three-minute limit. Mike Fisher, 4410 Van Kriston Drive, inquired how Council would regulate boisterous conduct. Claudette Smith, 4410 Van Kriston Drive, asked if City Council would find solutions to the naysayers' problems. She further commented on a restaurant closing to make repairs demanded by the City. Lilia Mitchell, 3124 Redwood Street, stated she was concerned about North Amarillo's conditions. She further stated she had previously requested a splash pad in Hazelrigg Park. Jerri Glover, 5707 Berget Street, spoke on Amarillo 101, and encouraged everyone to apply. She encouraged Council to look at the meeting times in the eyes of the citizens. Nathan Smith, 501 Fescue Avenue, spoke about the ballpark, taxes, and the number of people at the public comment forum. Zane Oliver, 4508 Greenwich Place, spoke on Item 3A and offered some clarification on the rezoning request.
