ITEM 3: <u>Amarillo Active Adult Study Report Discussion and Recommendations</u>. Advisory Board discussion included the Center Without Walls concept and recommendation, alternatives to one large facility, and Memorandum of Understanding scope of work, and providing options to extend the original work plan.

Steve Hoyl moved to recommend the Amarillo City Council acknowledge the essential need to provide reliable, consistent and engaging 21<sup>st</sup> Century programs and services for the city's almost 63,000 citizens 50 years of age and older; commit to working diligently with the community to establish City of Amarillo owned and operated programming as well as a "hub" facility to serve the 50+ active adult population within the next 5 years; and develop such facility and programming based upon the work completed in the "Blueprint for 21<sup>st</sup> Century Senior Centers" study and the "Amarillo 50+ Active Adult Programming Needs Assessment and Facility Feasibility Study." Clay Stribling seconded the motion. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

ITEM 4: Public Forum. There were no public comments.

ITEM 6: Next Meeting Date Discussion and Consideration. Linda Pitner noted the next and likely last meeting of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Senior Services Development Advisory Board will be held in August or September to update the board on any progress related to the final report and recommendation submission to the City Council.
