MINUTES

AMARILLO METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION POLICY COMMITTEE MEETING

The Policy Committee for the Amarillo Metropolitan Planning Organization met at 1:30 p.m., January 18, 2016, in Room 275 of the Simms Building, 808 South Buchanan, Amarillo, Texas.

Voting members present were: Jared Miller, Kit Black, Eddie Sauer, Kyle Ingham, Dick Davis, Mark Benton, and Brian Crawford.

Voting members not present were: Ernie Houdashell, HR Kelly, Ginger Nelson, Nancy Tanner

Ex Officio Members present: Randy Criswell

Staff coordinators were: Travis Muno, and Devin Jones.

<u>Item 1. Consider approval of the October 19, 2017 meeting minutes.</u>

Jared Miller opened the meeting in place of Mayor Nelson with a vote for approval of the October 19, 2017 minutes. Kyle Ingham moved to accept the minutes as they were written. Dick Davis seconded the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously by an 7:0 vote.

<u>Item 2. Discussion of the 2019-22 Draft Transportation Improvement Program Document.</u>

Mr. Travis Muno, MPO Senior Planner, advised the committee that no action would need to be taken on this item, but this was a preliminary draft of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Document. Travis explained that the new TIP was updated to uphold Fast Act. The document also holds the last 2 years of projects from the previous TIP and two future years worth of projects. Kyle Ingham asked if the projects in the TIP are completely funded. Travis answered that yes, in order to be placed in the TIP they must be fully funded. Dick Davis suggested a more simple table format that would provide important information at a quick glance for meetings.

Jared Miller brought up the discussion he'd had with AISD staff about a possible new project near 45th and 58th near Tradewinds, for bridges to go over or under the train tracks. New schools are in consideration to be built, and as it stands, these areas are not safe for walking, or prepared to handle the increased traffic. Dick Davis commented that this was something looked at around 30 years ago, but that there were issues with landowners, as there were several different owners of the land. The suggestion of the committee was for the school board members to be invited to the prioritization workshop to talk about their situation.

Travis made the board aware of the public meeting in February. Kyle Ingham asked if Amarillo's region was represented on the TxDOT Transportation Commission, and Brian answered that the region was discussed but not represented.

Travis explained that though this item did not need action to be taken, the TIP would be brought back in April to be voted in.

<u>Item 3. Update of the MPO Director posting and process.</u>

AJ Fawver, Director of Planning came before the committee to give an update on the search for a new MPO Director. She explained that the job request had been posted with SGR, and posted to several other websites to hopefully find a new candidate

quickly. The job will be posted for 30 days from the original posting, and will be taken down on February the 8th unless no applicant has been found. At that time it will be reposted and extended at no penalty. AJ explained that SGR would handle the prescreening of candidates, but a hiring board would be made once there were candidates to interview.

<u>Item 4. Consider the Safety Measures adopted by TxDOT</u>

Travis explained to the Policy Committee that the FAST act requires both TxDOT and MPO's to adopt safety performance measures. He also explained that TxDOT adopted their safety performance measures in August. The fast act set 5 basic safety targets, and they would continue to put more out in the coming months. The two options that the Amarillo MPO has, is to either adopt their own, or support the ones set by TxDOT. The TAC Committee suggested that the MPO adopt the TxDOT safety measures.

Jared Miller asked how difficult it would be for the safety measures to be met, and Travis explained that we already meet these safety measures fairly easily. Concern was brought up that we might lose funding if we did not meet these safety measures, however Travis explained that no funding would be revoked, only moved around to promote safer transportation.

Dick Davis moved to approve the Safety Measures adopted by TxDOT. Mark Benton seconded.

The motion passed unanimously with a 7:0 vote.

<u>Item 5. Discussion of the Metropolitan Area Boundary and Suggested</u> <u>Improvements</u>

Travis Muno and Bill Frawley together explained the necessity of expanding the MAB Boundary to include Canyon, Bushland, Lake Tanglewood, and a few other urban clusters around Amarillo. They presented the boundary that the TAC committee has been working on. Dick Davis asked what the area south area of the current boundary. The current boundary ends at Rockwell Road, and the area south of that is known as the Mascalero Urban Cluster. It was established that the ETJ areas for Amarillo and Canyon are currently overlapping, but are not considered a continuous urbanized area. If the MAB boundary is expanded there are several things that would need to be changed. The MPO Bylaws would need to be updated, the MPO would have to plan for a larger geographic area. However, it would give more accurate data, traffic is already moving between Amarillo and Canyon, and provides an opportunity to coordinate more directly with Canyon.

When questioned about his opinion, Randy Criswell was very supportive of the expansion. He said that Amarillo and Canyon are already considered to be together. He also stated that he understood his role as well as Canyon's was proportional to Amarillo.

Questions about whether funds would be spread thinner and if Canyon would lose their current funding was brought up, but Bill Frawley, and Terry Nix from TxDOT explained

this was not the case, and though it may be tight for a year or two, then once the new census went into effect, funding would even out.

This item was put on the agenda for the March workshop to discuss further.

Item 6. Open Forum.

There were no public comments.

Item 8. Adjournment.

The meeting was adjourned with no further business to discuss.

The Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act requires performance measures to be established to evaluate America's infrastructure. At the January Policy meeting the MPO adopted the first set of targets. These targets are for safety. The MPO is working with Transit to establish targets for the Transit Asset Management measures. There will be additional targets rolled out in the coming months. Another requirement of the FAST Act is to have the MPO, State, and the public transportation provider to jointly agree upon and develop specific written provisions for cooperatively developing and share information related to the performance measures and targets. This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) defines the roles and responsibilities of the MPO, TxDOT and Amarillo City Transit. The MPO staff has been coordinating with TxDOT staff and Amarillo City Transit staff and City of Amarillo legal department to get this MOU developed. This item will require formal action by the committee.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING AMONG

THE AMARILLO METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION ("MPO"), THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ("TxDOT") AND THE AMARILLO CITY TRANSIT, PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION OPERATOR

WHEREAS, the Safe, Accountable, Flexible and Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) promulgated regulations 23 CFR 450.314, and

WHEREAS, the MPO, the State and the Public Transportation Operator(s) are required by 23 CFR 450.314 to cooperatively determine their mutual responsibilities in carrying out the metropolitan transportation planning process, and

WHEREAS, these responsibilities shall be clearly identified in written agreements among the MPO, the State and the Public Transportation Operator(s) serving the Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA), and

WHEREAS, to the extent possible, a single agreement between all responsible parties should be developed, and

WHEREAS, the federal regulations require the written agreement to include specific provisions for cooperatively developing and sharing information related to the development of financial plans that support the Metropolitan Transportation Plan ("MTP"), the metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program ("TIP"), and development of the annual listing of obligated projects.

WHEREAS, the federal regulations require that the MPO, State DOT, and the public transit provider shall jointly agree upon and develop specific written procedures for cooperatively developing and sharing information related to transportation performance data, the selection of performance targets, the reporting of performance to be used in tracking progress toward attainment of critical outcomes for the region of the MPO, and the collection of data for the State asset management plan for the National Highway System (NHS).

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Purpose**. It is the purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to make provision for cooperative mutual responsibilities in carrying out the Metropolitan Planning Process and Performance Based Planning and Programming in the Amarillo MPA and to provide a single agreement between the State of Texas acting through the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), Amarillo MPO, and the Amarillo City Transit in accordance with current Federal Legislation and as required by 23 CFR 450.314.

2. Responsibilities of all parties.

All parties will:

a. Cooperatively determine their mutual responsibilities in carrying out the metropolitan transportation planning process in a performance based planning format and final form. Decide upon and adopt performance targets for this

planning process in accordance with Federal and State requirements and guidance.

- b. Make provisions for cooperatively developing and sharing information related to the development of financial plans that support the MTP and TIP.
- c. Ensure TxDOT, the Public Transportation Operator, and the MPO cooperatively develop a listing of projects that comprehensively address the transportation system within the MPO boundaries. Identified projects shall include both roadway and transit initiatives, including but not limited to investments in pedestrian walkways and bicycle transportation facilities for which federal funds were obligated in the preceding fiscal year.
- d. Ensure that the UPWP will detail and document these responsibilities, deliverables and associated costs.

3. Performance Based Planning & Programming

- a. Developing transportation performance data
 - i. TxDOT will provide the MPO with the statewide performance data used in developing statewide targets, and will also provide MPOs with subsets of the statewide data, based on their metropolitan planning area boundaries.
 - ii. If an MPO chooses to develop its own target for any measure, it will provide TxDOT with any supplemental data utilized in association with the target-setting process.

b. Selection of transportation performance targets

- i. TxDOT will develop draft statewide federal performance targets in coordination with the applicable MPOs. Coordination may include inperson meetings, web meetings, conference calls, and/or email communication. MPOs shall be given an opportunity to provide comments on statewide targets prior to final statewide targets adoption.
- ii. If the MPO chooses to adopt its own target for any measure, it will develop draft MPO performance targets in coordination with TxDOT.

Coordination methods will be at the discretion of the MPO, but TxDOT shall be provided an opportunity to provide comments on draft MPO performance targets prior to final approval.

- c. Reporting of performance targets
 - i. TxDOT performance targets will be reported to FHWA and FTA, as applicable. The MPO will be notified when TxDOT has reported final statewide targets.
 - ii. MPO performance targets will be reported to TxDOT.
 - 1. For each target, the MPO will provide the following information no later than 180 days after the date TxDOT or the Public Transportation Operator establishes performance targets, or the date specified by federal code:
 - a. Written agreement to plan and program projects so that they contribute toward the accomplishment of TxDOT or Public Transportation Operator performance target, or;
 - b. Written notification that the MPO will set a quantifiable target for that performance measure for the MPO's planning area.
 - i. If a quantifiable target is set for the MPO planning area, the MPO will provide any supplemental data used in determining any such target.
 - c. Documentation of the MPO's target or support of the statewide or relevant public transportation provider target will be provided in the form of a resolution or meeting minutes.
 - iii. TxDOT will include information outlined in 23 CFR 450.216 (f) in any statewide transportation plan amended or adopted after May 27, 2018, and information outlined in 23 CFR 450.218 (q) in any statewide transportation improvement program amended or adopted after May 27, 2018.

- iv. The MPO will include information outlined in 23 CFR 450.324 (g) (3-4) in any MTP amended or adopted after May 27, 2018, and information outlined in 23 CFR 450.326 (d) in any TIP amended or adopted after May 27, 2018.
- v. Reporting of targets and performance by TxDOT and the MPO shall conform to 23 CFR 490, 49 CFR 625, and 49 CFR 673.
- d. Reporting of performance to be used in tracking progress toward attainment of critical outcomes for the region of the MPO
 - i. TxDOT will provide the MPO with the statewide performance data used in developing statewide targets, and will also provide MPOs with subsets of the statewide data, based on their metropolitan planning area boundaries.
- e. The collection of data for the State asset management plans for the NHS
 - i. TxDOT will be responsible for collecting bridge and pavement condition data for the State asset management plan for the NHS.

4. Responsibilities of the MPO

The MPO will:

- a. Work in consultation with Public Transportation Operator and TxDOT in developing the financial plan for the MTP.
- b. Work in consultation with Public Transportation Operator and TxDOT in developing the financial plan for the TIP.
- c. Conduct Technical Committee and Policy Board meetings as required and necessary.
- d. In consultation with Public Transportation Operator and TxDOT, update the MTP and TIP in accordance with State and Federal laws.
- e. Invite Transit Districts to participate in all public participation processes.
- f. Conduct comprehensive, cooperative and continuous transportation planning for the Amarillo MPA.

g. Establish necessary transportation performance targets, share information related to the performance data, and document the reporting of performance to be used in tracking progress toward attainment of critical outcomes within the MPO MPA, if the MPO elects to develop quantifiable targets for performance measures for the MPO's planning area.

5. Responsibilities of the Public Transportation Operator

The Public Transportation Operator will:

- a. Work in consultation with the MPO in developing short-range and long-range plans for transit for inclusion in the MTP.
- b. Assist in validation of data used as input into the MTP.
- c. Work in consultation with the MPO and TxDOT in developing the financial plan for the MTP.
- d. Work in consultation with the MPO and TXDOT in developing the financial plan for the TIP.
- e. Provide the MPO with the annual list of transit obligated projects.
- f. Serve on the MPO Technical Committee and Policy Board as applicable.
- g. Notify the MPO of changes to projects that would affect the MTP or TIP.
- h. Invite the MPO to participate in all public participation processes.
- i. Establish transit asset management performance targets and share with the MPO and other interested parties.

6. Responsibilities of TxDOT.

- a. Work in consultation with Public Transportation Operator and the MPO in developing the financial plan for the TIP and MTP.
- b. Assist in the validation of data used as input into the MTP.
- c. Provide the MPO with the annual list of obligated projects.
- d. Serve on the MPO Technical Committee and Policy Board.

- e. Notify the MPO of changes to projects that would affect the MTP or TIP.
- f. In consultation with the MPO and Transit District, update the MTP and TIP in accordance with State and Federal laws.
- g. Work in consultation with the MPO and Public Transportation Operator in developing short-range and long-range plans for transit for inclusion in the MTP and TIP.
- 7. **Term**. This Memorandum shall become effective as to each Party when fully executed by all parties. It shall remain in full force and effect until such time it is terminated in writing by one or all of the parties.
- 8. **Validity and Enforceability.** If any current or future legal limitations affect the validity or enforceability of a provision of this MOU, then the legal limitations are made a part of this MOU and shall operate to amend this MOU to the minimum extent necessary to bring this MOU into conformity with the requirements of the limitations, and so modified, this MOU shall continue in full force and effect.
- 9. **Governing Law and Venue**. This MOU shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for an action arising under this MOU shall lie exclusively in Travis County, Texas.
- 10. **Severability**. If a provision contained in this MOU is held invalid for any reason, the invalidity does not affect other provisions of the MOU and can be given effect without the invalid provision, and to this end the provisions of this MOU are severable.

RESOLUTION NO. 18-1-2018-1

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE SAFETY PERFORMANCE TARGETS ESTABLISHED BY THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

WHEREAS, Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act and subsequent Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act require the implementation of Performance Measures to assist in the transportation planning process; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Department of Transportation has adopted its Strategic Highway Safety Plan, a data-driven statewide-coordinated safety plan to help reduce fatalities and serious injuries on all public roads; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Department of Transportation has established targets for five Safety Performance Measures based on five-year rolling averages for:

- 1. Number of Fatalities,
- 2. Rate of Fatalities per 100 million Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT),
- 3. Number of Serious Injuries,
- 4. Rate of Serious Injuries per 100 million VMT, and
- 5. Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Non-Motorized Serious Injuries

WHEREAS, the Texas Department of Transportation has officially established safety targets in the Highway Safety Improvement Program annual report dated August 31, 2017, and has adopted identical safety targets for number of fatalities, rate of fatalities, and number of serious injuries as set forth in the Strategic Highway Safety Plan, and as shown in APPENDIX A, attached hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE AMARILLO MPO THAT:

The Policy Board hereby adopts the Texas Department of Transportation's Safety Performance Targets within the Metropolitan Area Boundary, this the 18th day of January 2018.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Policy Board will plan and program projects that contribute to the accomplishments of said targets.

The project priority list from last year is shown below. The table has some additional columns. The first is on the left hand side. This is the ranking for this year. The next column is the ranking from last year. The third column is where the project info starts. Then after the projects description columns are the columns showing the project cost. The first cost column is the construction cost in 2017. The next column is the construction cost in 2018. Then the third cost column is the construction cost inflated to the year the project is scheduled to let. The listing as shown is a result of the discussion from the Policy Committee workshop last month. The only project that was slid down the list is the operational project on Soncy. This was because of a couple of reasons. First it is to allow time to reevaluate the way traffic moves on Soncy after the current project is finished. Second once Loop 335 is moved to the Helium corridor, Soncy will function differently than it does today. As a result of these two endeavors the operational improvement project on Soncy was moved down. This item will require formal action by the committee.

The FY 2019-22 Transportation Improvement Program is the short range document that will cover the next four year period. The TIP is made up of road, bridge and transit projects. The projects in the TIP have to be financially constrained and must originate in the Metropolitan Transportation Plan. Once approved this document will take affect October 1 of this year.

In Fiscal Year 19 is where you will find the first phase of B-2. This will be the frontage road piece of the southwest quadrant. This project will start at FM 2590 and continue west to the Helium rd corridor. The project will then continue north along Helium road to I-40. This roadway segment will function as a four lane divided highway until such time that the main lanes are constructed.

Fiscal year 20 is when the Bridge at IH 40 will be reconstructed. This will be the second level of the future interchange at IH 40 and SL 335. Also in fiscal year 20 is the segment of SL 335 which runs from IH 40 to SW 9th Ave. This section of roadway will also be for frontage roads only.

Fiscal year 21 has the project which ties B-2 and B-1 together. This is the piece of SL 335 from FM 2590 to just west of Coulter St. This will remove the big curve and realign the intersection of Soncy Rd. and Hollywood Rd.

Also listed in the document are a collection of grouped projects which consist mainly of TxDOT preventative maintenance projects such as overlays and bridge work. These projects are for information purposes only.

Along with the highway funding the TIP contains funding for Amarillo City Transit. Over the next four years the projects identified are operating expenses for both fixed route and Spec-Trans. This includes regular and preventative maintenance. There are also funds identified for vehicle replacement.

The TIP document also has identified local funds that will be used to maintain the transportation system over the next four years. These local figures are listed here for informational purposes only.

This document has been updated since the January meeting to include the performance measures that were adopted at that Policy Meeting. The funding in the individual listed projects has also been updated to reflect the most current estimates. The MPO conducted another public meeting February 15, 2018. There was a 30 day comment period from February 15, 2018 until March 19, 2018. This item will require formal action by the committee.

I. Introduction

The transportation planning process in the Amarillo Urban Transportation Study Area is carried out by the Amarillo Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) in cooperation with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), Potter and Randall Counties, the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission, and the City of Amarillo.

Although the Governor of the State of Texas designated the City of Amarillo as the fiscal agent for the MPO, the Amarillo Metropolitan Planning Organization's Policy Committee administers the transportation planning process in the Amarillo urbanized area. The MPO designation was renewed by contract with TxDOT executed in May 2012.

The federal legislation currently in place is the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act, or FAST Act. The FAST Act creates a streamlined and performance-based surface transportation program and builds on many of the highway, transit, bike, and pedestrian programs and policies first established in 1991.

Those earlier legislative actions the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991 (ISTEA), the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21), the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act – A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU), and the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) increased investment in highway, transit, and safety programs, while retaining the basic goals and structure of earlier transportation actions. The FAST Act continues to encourage an enhanced role for local decision-making and places important emphasis on flexibility, intermodal goals, and on addressing local and regional needs. In addition, the FAST Act elevates the importance of safety by continuing core safety programs, guaranteeing funds for transportation programs; streamlining the environmental review and project delivery process, and promotes performance based planning initiatives. The goals of the FAST Act, as well as those of the Amarillo Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) and the Amarillo Comprehensive Plan, are the core of the urban transportation policy in the AUTS area.

The MPO ensures that transportation plans and programs are consistent with the objectives and goals of the overall urban transportation planning process. It is charged with providing guidance and technical assistance for multi-modal transportation planning and reviewing recommended transportation plans and programs. Primary documents produced by the MPO include the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP). The MPO also plays a significant role in transit planning activities.

Purpose

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is a staged, multi-year program of transportation improvements required by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for urbanized areas receiving federal transportation funds. The purposes of the TIP include:

- 1. Identification of transportation improvements recommended for advancement during the 4-year program period.
- 2. Identification of transportation improvement priorities.
- 3. Provide realistic estimates of total costs and revenues for the program period.
- 4. Facilitate a cooperative transportation planning process.

In order for projects to be included in the TIP, and thus be eligible for federal funding, they must first be included in the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP). The MTP is developed through the use of the traffic-forecasting model, which is operated by the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT). Projects selected for implementation in the TIP have already been subjected to analysis and evaluation procedures based on policy and planning goals set forth in the MTP. Thus, the TIP is considered as one step toward meeting the goals of the MTP.

Definition of Area

The Amarillo Urban Transportation Study area includes the city of Amarillo and portions of rural Potter and Randall Counties. The boundaries of the study area correspond to that area of the region that is likely to become urbanized in the next 20 years. These boundaries also correspond to the limits of the Travel Forecasting Model operated by the Texas Department of Transportation.

Public Involvement Process

Public involvement is assured in the Amarillo Urban Transportation Study through the adopted Public Participation Plan (PPP). The PPP gives citizens the opportunity to comment during all phases of the transportation planning process. The City of Amarillo Traffic Commission and the Amarillo Advisory Commission for People with Disabilities also play a significant role in the development and improvement of transportation plans and programs through recommendation to the MPO staff.

Public meetings for comment and development of the draft TIP were held in Amarillo on November 16, 2017 and February 24, 2016. A draft Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) was presented to the MPO Policy Committee for review at the committee's quarterly meeting on January 18, 2018. Throughout the fiscal years 2017 and 2018 MPO staff continued to ask for input from the public and transportation stakeholders regarding the TIP program and projects. The draft Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) was presented a second time to the MPO Policy Committee for review, at the quarterly meeting on April 19, 2018. This 2019-2022 TIP includes the results of various public meetings, review sessions, and comments received from October 2017 through April 2018.

Numerous public involvement activities were conducted. These included several 30-day public comment periods. During the comment periods and public meetings citizen input on the draft TIP was sought. These meetings were open to the public and posted as outlined in the MPO's PPP. There was also regional newspaper coverage and advertising regarding the 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Program. The MPO's mailing list of stakeholders and interested parties was used to send meeting notices and to contact local, state, tribal, and federal stakeholders for input and comment regarding the development of the 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Program in compliance with the FAST Act directives. During these public forums, MPO staff sought comments and answered questions from the public about the planning process, project selection, and the draft 2019-2022 TIP. The comments received have been reviewed by the MPO Policy Committee and provided to the appropriate agency: the Texas Department of Transportation Amarillo District Office, the City of Amarillo, Potter County, or Randall County. Amarillo MPO public involvement requirements were followed and documented in the development of the TIP. This information will be furnished upon request.

Project Selection Process

Projects programmed in the TIP are evaluated using a variety of criteria. The criteria used to evaluate a particular project depend on the type of project and how far the project goes toward meeting the goals of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan. The items below include the major elements that are considered in selecting projects.

- Preservation of the Capital Investment
- Safety
- Congestion Relief

- Environmental Protection and Enhancement
- Economic Development
- Aesthetics

Grouped Project CSJs (Control Section Job)

The Amarillo MPO is participating in the use of grouped projects in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration and the Texas Department of Transportation. TxDOT developed Grouped Project CSJ numbers for projects that are not determined to be regionally significant. This allows those projects to be grouped in one line item as permitted in Title 23 USC section 135 Statewide Planning. Grouped projects in the form of an individual line item adopted by the MPO policy board are in fact preapproved by the MPO policy board for purposes of grouping similar types of projects for TIP

programming in the future. Grouped exempt projects may be handled by the MPO as an administrative TIP revision, which does not require a formal STIP major revision approval action by FHWA and FTA in conjunction with TXDOT District Offices and TPP (System Planning).

Progress from Previous Years

Federally Funded Projects – The following major projects have been implemented or are currently under construction:

IH-27 – from Sundown Lane to Bell Street – B-1 Phase 1: Reconstruct Main lane Bridges and Approaches at SL 335 (2nd Level) to accommodate future expansion to 6 Lanes

SL 335 – From IH 27 to Bell Street – B-1 Phase 1: Construct Frontage roads to Accommodate Future Main lane Bridge at IH 27 (3rd Level)

SL 335 – from West of Coulter to IH 27; B-1 Phase I: Construct Frontage roads and Grade Separation at Coulter

IH 40 – At Whitaker Rd: Replace Existing Bridges and Approaches

IH-40 – At SL 335 (Lakeside): Replace Existing Bridges and Approaches

IH 40 – At FM 1258: Replace Existing Bridges and Approaches

Federally Funded Transit Projects - Amarillo City Transit received operating and capital assistance from Section 5307 funds. The associated capital projects were for acquisition of replacement vehicles and support equipment.

Amarillo area Section 5310 funds are utilized through services provided by Panhandle Community Services.

Performance Based Planning Issues

The Amarillo MPO has developed this FY 2019-22 Transportation Improvement Program to support the fulfillment of national goals identified in the most recent federal transportation bill. Those goals are of prime importance:

Safety Infrastructure Condition Congestion Reduction System Reliability Freight Movement & Economic Vitality Environmental Sustainability Reduced Project Delivery Dates

The Amarillo MPO will work in cooperation with TxDOT to carry out USDOT Performance-Based Planning directives. The Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act is the current transportation law. The FAST Act requires the consideration of two new planning factors. The first is encouraging consultation with agencies that plan for tourism and natural disaster risk reduction. The second is planning for system resiliency and reliability and reducing or mitigating storm-water impacts of surface transportation.

Under the FAST Act, State DOTs and MPOs are required establish performance targets and evaluate the progress made toward achieving the performance targets for the following performance measures:

Safety

The Texas Department of Transportation has officially established five safety targets based on five year rolling averages.

These performance targets were developed during the update for the 2017-2022 Strategic Highway Safety plan. These targets carry through into the state's Highway Safety Improvement Plan and the Highway safety Plan. These targets are a 2% reduction from the original trend line projected out to 2020.

The Amarillo MPO Policy Committee adopted TxDOT's Safety targets and committed to supporting, planning and programming projects that contribute to the accomplishments of these targets at their Policy Committee meeting on January 18, 2018.

The projects listed in the 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Program support achieving these safety targets. The projects include added capacity and operational improvements that include bicycle and pedestrian facilities, intersection improvements, grade separated overpasses, as well as improving freight movement.

Air Quality Issues

The Clean Air Act of 1990 places several requirements on communities to maintain and improve urban air quality. In response to the Act, the U.S. Department of Transportation has identified those communities in the nation with poor air quality as non-attainment areas and those with good air quality are classified as attainment areas. Although Amarillo has been identified as an attainment area, consideration is still given to the maintenance of good air quality through the appropriate mix of land uses with their resulting travel patterns and through a program to synchronize traffic signals on arterial roads to decrease delay and travel time, resulting in reduced fuel consumption and lower vehicle emissions per vehicle miles traveled.

Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)

The ADA was designed to establish equal rights for persons with disabilities. The ADA requires municipalities to develop programs that do not discriminate against persons with disabilities solely on the basis of a physical or mental disability. The Act addresses several areas including employment, public services, non-discrimination in the private sector, and telecommunications access. The City of Amarillo includes persons with disabilities in the development of all of its employment programs and public programs and facilities. A significant portion of Amarillo's response to the ADA is directly related to improvements to the Amarillo City Transit system.

The Amarillo MPO was established in the early 1970's. The current MPO area boundary (MAB) was established then and has never been changed. This means the current boundary has not been changed in approximately 45 years. In looking to update this boundary, the MAB by definition at a minimum should include the entire urbanized area and the contiguous area expected to become urbanized in a 20 year forecast period. In considering changing the MAB the Technical advisory committee and the Policy Committee are analyzing where the growth that has occurred in recent years, the areas where growth is planned in the coming years, and the travel patterns from a regional perspective. There are many areas near Amarillo that contribute to the traffic patterns in the MPO. Some of these areas are Bishop Hills, Bushland, Canyon, Timbercreek, Palisades, Lake Tanglewood, and the Mescalero urban area (which is located between Amarillo and Canyon).

Changing the MAB could result in many benefits for the MPO. It would allow for planning for an appropriate area. Travel among the nearby areas already exists and is interacting with the traffic in the MPO. Since the use of federal planning funds is almost completely limited to within the MAB, expanding the boundary would allow for better analysis and more thorough solutions. A second benefit would be to provide the most accurate data to be included in funding formulas. Since population and total vehicle miles traveled (VMT) are the two biggest components of the Category 2 funding formula. We need to provide as accurate data as possible. Although we are looking to expand the area where funding can be applied, we must keep in mind all roads with a functional classification of Rural Minor Collector or Local are not eligible for most federal funding categories. Another benefit is it will get us out ahead of TMA status, which would be coming with the 2020 census.

Expanding the boundary would also have some impacts to the MPO. It would bring the City of Canyon in as a voting member of the policy board. This change would require bylaw changes and possibly and rebalancing of the Policy board and Technical advisory board. It would also require planning for a larger geographic area. Once the proposed boundary and other changes are adopted, the documentation and Policy Board action will be forwarded to TxDOT planning and programming division for their review and approval. Once approved by TxDOT it will be forwarded on to the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration. The boundary becomes effective at the time TxDOT approves it. This item will require formal action by the committee.
