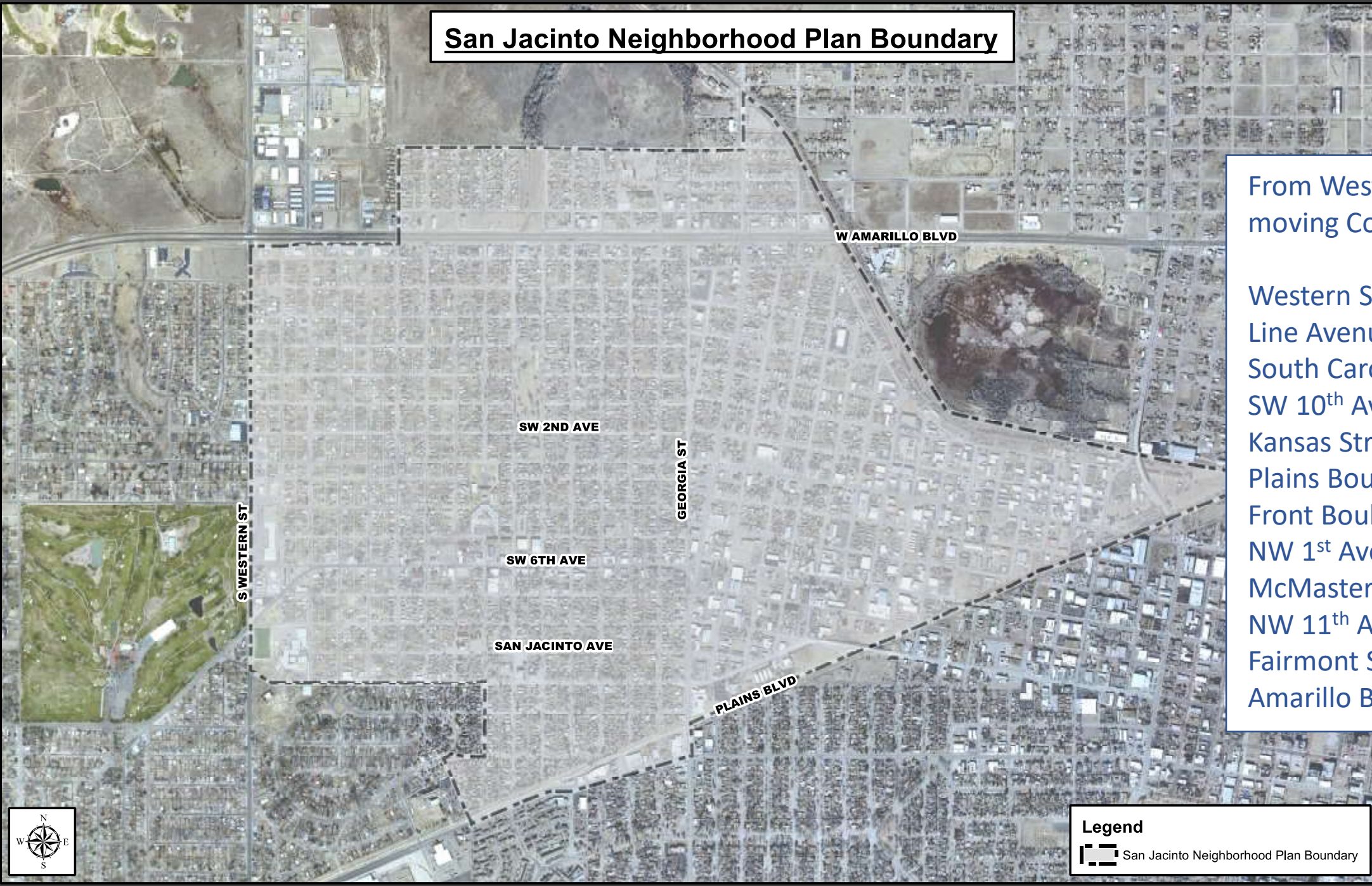

- Amarillo Boulevard



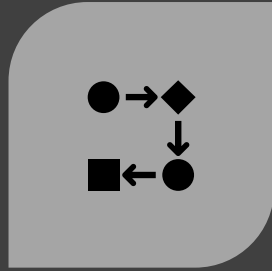

# Analyze and Visualize: Completed to Date

## **EXISTING CONDITIONS MAPS AND DATA**

- Demographics (population data)
  - Overall population, household size, race, age, median income
- Property Information
  - Owner-/renter-occupied, assessed values, market values, primary owners
- Land Use Data
  - Future land uses, zoning, vacant land
- Historic Information
  - Points of interest, catalog of significant properties, books, photos

# Analyze and Visualize: Completed to Date

## **EXISTING CONDITIONS MAPS AND DATA**

- Crime Data
- Transportation Information
  - Transit accessibility, intersections of concern, pedestrian crashes
- Infrastructure Data
  - Utilities, sidewalk inventory, Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) projects
- Code Violations
  - Weeds, substandard housing, condemned buildings, junk vehicles

# Analyze and Visualize: Completed to Date

## **SWOT EXERCISE**

- Strengths – Things we LOVE about San Jacinto!
- Weaknesses – San Jacinto's Disadvantages or Faults
- Opportunities – Specific circumstances that make it possible to do something
- Threats – Specific circumstances that could damage or endanger the neighborhood

# ADVISORY COMMITTEE DECISION-MAKING PROCESS

## Consensus-Based Decision Making

- Members vote on ideas – four voting options
  - *Assent*
  - *Assent with Reservation*
  - *Stand Aside*
  - *Block*
- 80/20 Rule –  
*Ideas do not move forward if >20% BLOCK or STAND ASIDE*

# ADVISORY COMMITTEE DECISION-MAKING PROCESS



- Decisions are made after all members have provided equal input.
- Decisions reflect the integrated will of the whole group
- Decisions may not be everyone's first preference or favorite idea

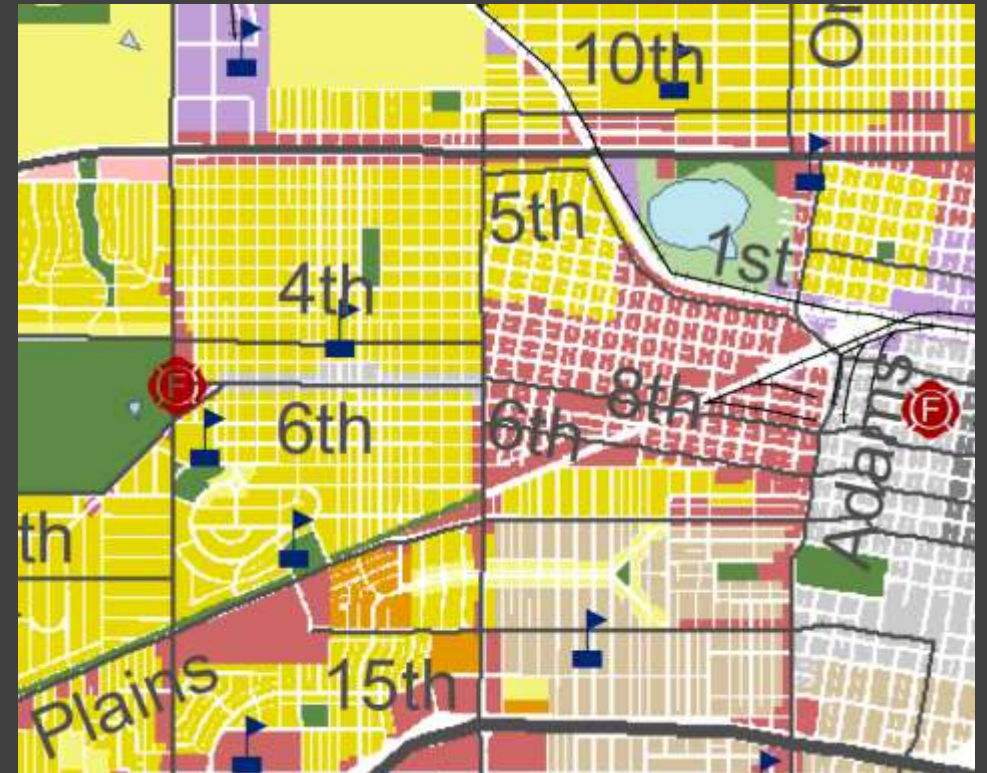

# Analyze and Visualize: Completed to Date

## **LAND USE GUIDING PRINCIPLES**

- Principles are consistent with other Amarillo neighborhood plans (i.e. Barrio and North Heights)
- Examples:
  - Diversify the types of businesses and create job opportunities.
  - Promote areas of historical and cultural significance.
  - Limit development in floodplains and environmentally sensitive areas.

# CLEAN AND SAFE GOALS

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- We will take action to reduce crime and to improve overall safety of our neighborhood for our residents, businesses, and visitors.
- We will strive to increase access to services that support our community's physical health, mental health and wellness needs.
- We will create projects and programs to maintain a clean and beautiful neighborhood.



# ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT GOALS (JOBS AND BUSINESSES)

- We will build upon the success of 6<sup>th</sup> Street businesses and encourage new entrepreneurs to establish their businesses with San Jacinto.
- We will use placemaking (creating beautiful public spaces) as a tool for economic development.
- We will expand employment and training opportunities for local residents within the neighborhood.



# HISTORY AND CULTURE GOALS

- We will honor the legacy of Historic San Jacinto and its unique cultural heritage that make the neighborhood one-of-a-kind.
- We will highlight the artistic and creative spirit of the neighborhood by promoting the visual and performing arts.



# HOUSING GOALS

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- We will enhance the neighborhood's existing housing stock while introducing new housing options to improve access to quality places to live at a wide variety of prices.
- We will encourage and support homeownership in the neighborhood to create a healthy balance of renters and homeowners.



# INFRASTRUCTURE GOALS (STREETS, SIDEWALKS & UTILITIES)



- We will enhance the neighborhood's connectivity.
- We will improve our utilities and other infrastructure to encourage private investment in the neighborhood.



# SUSTAINABILITY GOALS (NATURE AND THE ENVIRONMENT)

- We will employ green infrastructure when/where possible throughout the neighborhood.
- We will support San Jacinto businesses as they become the most environmentally responsible businesses in all of Amarillo.



# SOCIAL CAPACITY GOALS (COMMUNITY BUILDING)

- We will create more opportunities for all residents of San Jacinto to gather and celebrate.
- We will connect our residents, businesses and other stakeholders with resources to improve the neighborhood.
