Agenda Item Summary

This item is the second and final reading the ordinance amending the Amarillo Municipal Code, Chapter 8-5, to reserve sections and to add a new article VI, to provide for the public health department, providing clauses for severability, repealer, continuation of prior law and obligations; providing an effective date.

Requested Action

Second and final reading of the ordinance.

Funding Summary

Funding for the public health comes from a variety of sources. Funding does not change with the update to the municipal code.

WHEREAS, the City of Amarillo has, for many years, bifurcated the broad mandate for health and sanitation responsibilities between an Environmental Health Department and a Public Health Department; and,

WHEREAS, the duties and scope of responsibility of the Environmental Health Department is provided in other Articles of Chapter 8-5 of the Municipal Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the City Council now desires to ratify and affirm the legacy of service provided by the Public Health Department and, to more formally state the duties and scope of responsibility of that Department in a new Article VI to be enacted by this ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AMARILLO, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. The Amarillo Municipal Code, Chapter 8-5, be and hereby is amended, first to reserve certain sections in Article V, and then to add a new Article VI, to read as follows:

Section 8-5-290 to 8-5-299. Reserved.

ARTICLE VI. PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT

Sec. 8-5-300. General.

(a) There is created the Public Health Department of the City of Amarillo to perform the duties and programs described in this Article, and as may otherwise be assigned by the City Manager. The City Manager shall appoint the Director of Public Health to manage and administer the Public Health Department and provide Public Health Services as described in this Article, and other duties and program as assigned.

(b) All prior final decisions, acts, and expenditures related to and arising out of past public health decisions and activities of the City Manager, Public Health Department employees, other City officials, which occurred in accordance with general municipal legal authority, and prior to enactment of this Article, are hereby ratified and approved as authorized official acts, notwithstanding the absence of this Article at the time such decision or activity.

Sec. 8-5-301 Definitions.

In this Article, the following terms have the meaning indicated.

Amarillo Area Public Health Board is as defined in Article I, Section 8-5-1.

Amarillo Area Public Health District is as defined in Article I, Section 8-5-1.

<u>Director</u> means the Director of the Public Health Department and any designee for a particular time or purpose.

Director of Public Health is as defined in Article I, Section 8-5-1.

Health Authority is as defined in Article I, Section 8-5-1.

Public Health Services means programs that provide for health promotion and maintenance of the community; infectious disease control and prevention services in the community; consumer health programs; health education and information services, laboratory services; and administrative services.

Sec. 8-5-302 Duties and Responsibilities.

- (a) Subject to appropriation, the Department shall provide Public Health Services to persons within the City of Amarillo and within the area of the Amarillo Area Public Health District, such as but not limited to the following:
 - 1. Child and Adult Immunization Program
 - 2. Tuberculosis/Hansen's Control Program
 - 3. Sexually Transmitted Infection/HIV Prevention Program
 - 4. Communicable Disease Response Program
 - 5. Refugee Health Program
 - 6. Maternal Child Health Program
 - 7. Public Health Emergency Preparedness
 - 8. Chronic Disease Prevention Program
 - 9. Other programs for Public Health Services as may be created to address other public health issues in the community in the future, in accordance with the program approval procedures in effect at that time.
- (b) The Department may also provide Public Health Services pursuant to a mutual aid request form the neighboring region, or intergovernmental cooperation agreement with another jurisdiction in the region, or at the request of the Texas Department of State Health Services.
- (c) As directed or approved by the City Manager, the Department may seek funding from all available and appropriate sources, including but not limited to City budgetary appropriation, public and private grants, cooperative arrangements for in-kind exchange or support, and appropriations from other governmental jurisdictions, such as a hospital districts or universities.

Sec. 8-5-303. Fees.

The Department is authorized to collect the following chart of fees for various services, drugs, medical equipment and disposable supplies that are delivered by the Department to patients:

Sec. 8-5-304 to 3-5-350. Reserved.

SECTION 2. Severability. If any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances for any reason is held to be unconstitutional, void or invalid or for any reason unenforceable, the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance or the application thereby shall remain in effect, it being the intent of the City Council of the City of Amarillo, Texas in adopting this ordinance, that no portion thereof or provision contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by any reasons of unconstitutionality of any other portion or provision.

SECTION 3. Repealer. All ordinances, parts of ordinances resolutions and parts of resolutions in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of conflict with this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Continuation. Notwithstanding Section 3, nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to affect any existing program, contractual obligation, suit, or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing; and such prior right, obligation, law, or cause is continued in effect for purposes of such pending matter.

SECTION 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective upon final adoption.

Agenda Item Summary

The above referenced Aviation Clear Zone (ACZ) Easement is being requested by the City of Amarillo and is associated with the plat Yucca Addition Unit No. 4.

To ensure safety of operation and protection of air traffic operating into and out of the airport, future physical development around the airport needs to be regulated. In 1981, the Texas Legislature enacted the Airport Zoning Act, cited as Chapter 241 of the Local Government Code, which authorized cities in the state to establish and administer regulations pertaining to the height of structures and compatible land uses in the vicinity of the airport. One of the tools established in the Amarillo Code of Ordinances that allows the City of Amarillo to regulate this type of development is the Airport Height Hazard and Zoning Regulations (Chapter 4-9) which establishes minimum requirements to control the height and use of structures that may develop in the vicinity of the airport.

The ACZ Easement document is established during the platting of a tract of land to set the height regulations for noting on the associated plat, and the legal document is signed by the owner/developer of the tract. The placement of the note on the plat ensures that the height regulation is easily found by any future owner of the tract of land. Each ACZ Easement has an associated height regulation that is determined by the tract's proximity and location around the airport. For example, areas at the end of the runway will likely have a lower height regulation that ones at the same distance that are located adjacent to the length of the runway. The reason for this is because aircraft taking off or landing will need to be at a lower altitude during its approach or departure portion of the traffic pattern for the each associated runway.

This ACZ Easement is establishing a height regulation of 4,450 feet above mean sea level for the plat of Yucca Addition Unit No. 4.



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Planning Staff have reviewed the associated Aviation Clear Zone Easement and the item is ready for City Council Consideration as a consent agenda item.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the sum of TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00) and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, GRANTOR does for himself, his successors and assigns, GRANT, BARGAIN, SELL AND CONVEY unto the City of Amarillo, Texas, hereinafter called GRANTEE, its successors and assigns, for the use and benefit of the public, and easement and right-of-way appurtenant to Rick Husband Amarillo International Airport for the unobstructed passage of all aircraft, "aircraft" being defined for the purpose of this instrument as any contrivance now known or hereafter invented, used or designed for navigation of or flight in the air, by whomsoever owned or operated, in the airspace above GRANTOR'S above-described property; together with the right to cause in all airspace such noise, vibration, fumes, dust, fuel particulates and all other effects that may be caused by the operation of aircraft landing at, or taking off from, or operating at, on, over the above described property; and GRANTOR, his successors, executors, heirs or assigns, does hereby fully waive, remise and release any right, cause of action, and damage which it may now have or which it may have in the future against GRANTEE, its successors and assigns, due to such noise, vibrations, fumes, dust, fuel particulates and all other effects that may be caused or may have been caused by the operation of aircraft landing at, or taking off from, or operating near or on Rick Husband Amarillo International Airport or over the described property.

GRANTOR, for itself, its successors and assigns, does hereby covenant and agree that it will not hereafter erect, or permit the erection or growth of, any structure, tree or other object on the above described property to any height in excess of 4,450 feet above mean sea level. GRANTOR does hereby GRANT and CONVEY to GRANTEE a continuing right of ingress and egress via passage easement on and across the above-described property for the purpose of taking any action necessary to remove any structure, tree or other object in the airspace to any elevation greater than 4,450 feet above mean sea level.



Agenda Item Summary

The applicant is requesting abandonment of the above-mentioned alley in order to consolidate the east and west halves of Block 82 into a unified development site for development of the new Potter County Courthouse.

The alleyway proposed to be abandoned is located within a block in Downtown Amarillo and all land adjacent to the alley is vacant. The applicant owns all land within the block.

This vacation request has been reviewed by the typical City departments and local utility companies. There are several utilities within the alley to be abandoned, however the applicant will be relocating all utility equipment in the alley prior to construction.

As with any request to vacate public right-of-way, an applicant is required to either pay fair market value to acquire the alleyway, dedicate an area of equal or greater value, pay only the higher cost of the fair market value or the relocation cost, or complete a combination of these requirements.

In this particular case and alluded to above, the applicant will be relocating all existing utilities in the alley to accommodate the new Potter County Courthouse. Estimated relocation costs are \$150,000 and this far exceeds the appraised value of the alley (\$46,000). Therefore, no fair market value payment will be required.

Requested Action/Recommendation

Considering the above, The Planning and Zoning Commission is of the opinion that the alley requested for abandonment no longer serves a public purpose as originally intended and if vacated will not have any detrimental impacts on the area. Therefore, Planning Commissioners recommend as presented.

Notices have been sent to property owners within 200 feet regarding this proposed vacation. At the time of this writing, the Planning Department has not received any comments regarding the request.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF AMARILLO, TEXAS DETERMINING LACK OF PUBLIC NECESSITY FOR AN ALLEY IN THE VICINITY OF SOUTHEAST SEVENTH AVENUE AND SOUTH POTTER COUNTY. STREET, PIERCE **ABANDONING** THE VACATING AND DESCRIBED RIGHT-OF-WAY SAVE AND EXCEPT A PUBLIC UTILITY EASEMENT; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO CONVEY SUCH REAL PROPERTY ABUTTING LANDOWNERS; PROVIDING FOR TO **SEVERABILITY**; REPEALER: **PROVIDING FOR** PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Potter County, Texas petitioned the City of Amarillo to abandon an existing twenty foot (20') alley right-of-way located in the vicinity of Southeast Seventh Avenue and South Pierce Street, Potter County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing information presented, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Amarillo has recommended to the City Council that there is no public necessity for the following-described alley; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, having reviewed said recommendation and having considered all relevant information pertaining to the proposed vacation described below, is of the opinion that same is no longer needed for public purposes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council further decides that such vacation of alley right-of-way excepted a public utility easement, which is retained for current utilities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council further determined that this alley vacation and abandonment is not detrimental or injurious to the public health, safety or general welfare, or otherwise offensive to the neighborhood and is in the best interest of the City of Amarillo's citizens

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AMARILLO, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: That the herein-described ALLEY to be vacated and abandoned for public purposes:

Vacation of an existing 20-foot alley lying between Lots 1 through 5 and 6 through 10, Block 82, Plemons Addition, in Section 170, Block 2, A.B.&M. Survey, Potter County, Texas and being further described in the attached Exhibit 1 incorporated herein.

SAVE AND EXCEPT: A Public Utility Easement is hereby retained over the entire area of abandonment. Upon completed relocation/ rerouting of existing utility equipment, said portion of the Public Utility Easement encroached upon with a structure and/ or no longer containing utility equipment, shall be abandoned entirely.

SECTION 2: The City Manager is authorized to execute an instrument of conveyance to abutting land owner(s) as allowed by law.

SECTION 3: <u>Repealer</u>. All ordinances and resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of conflict with this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: <u>Severability</u>. If any provision, section, subsection, clause or the application of sale to any person or set of circumstances for any reason is held to be unconstitutional, void or


invalid or for any reason unenforceable, the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or the application thereby shall remain in effect, it being the intent of the City Council of the City of Amarillo, Texas in adopting this Ordinance, that no portion thereof or provision contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by any reasons of unconstitutionality of any other portion or provision.

SECTION 5: <u>Effective Date</u>: This Ordinance shall be effective from and after its date of final passage.
