



"Create a Sense of Community" Quick-Action Projects

1. STREET SIGN TOPPERS

NHAA Project Lead: 2

Project Description: The Street Sign topper project will locate approximately 96 signs in the North Heights neighborhood. The total ordered will be 116 accounting for an additional 20% for maintenance and repair. The signs will be designed by city staff, fabricated, and then installed by the city as well.



Estimated Cost: \$9,280 or \$80 per sign

Action Steps:

- Map potential locations and determine quantity COA Neighborhood Planning
- Generate ideas for design NHAA
- Provide design mockups COA Neighborhood Planning
- Approve design and locations NHAA
- · Fabricate and install signs COA Public Works Traffic

Status Update 1/30/20: Neighborhood voted and approved a sign design. Planning staff currently working with Traffic Dept to fabricate.

2. BUS STOP SHELTERS

NHAA Project Lead: 2

Project Description: Bus stop shelters for the public bus routes will be installed at stops selected by the NHAA. COA's transit department is making improvements to several stops including the addition of 1-2 shelters in 2020. These will be in addition to those planned improvements. The shelters will also offer the opportunity for public art displays.



Estimated Cost: Rough quotes for Eclipse Dome and Flat 5' X 10'
Shelter is \$6,000 to \$6,500 per shelter not including shipping and

taxes. Solar powered lights are additional \$1,500 to \$1,600. A bench is an additional \$250. Engineering and construction costs are currently estimated at \$11,000 to \$13,000.

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


What is the purpose of a neighborhood association?

- Set annual action plan (Projects in Motion)
- Establish committees to oversee projects
- Serve as communication hub
- Fundraise and generate support

- Identify Projects in Motion and the committees needed to accomplish those.
- Adopt bylaws, determine meeting structure and establish communication network.
- Formalize implementation partnership with COA.
 - Provide single point of contact for communications.
 - Determine allocation of 2016 bond funds.
