- No computer aided or copy-machine poster entries.
- A completed entry form must be attached to the back upper right corner of each poster submitted.
- Reproducibility of the poster will be a factor in the judges' decisions, so use good lettering and bright, high contrast colors.
- Entries MUST be received by May 1, 2020, and may be turned in at any Amarillo Public Library or the second floor of the Simms Municipal Building.
- Judge's decisions are final. Prizes cannot be redeemed for money.
