- The contest theme is "Every Drop Counts."
- The poster should be artistic, positive in approach, and focus on water conservation.
- Poster must be at least 11 x 8.5 inches, but not larger than 17 x 11 inches and must be in a landscape (horizontal) layout.
- Poster may be submitted on paper or poster board.
- Must be student's original artwork.
- No signatures on posters.
- No syndicated, copyrighted or clipart images.
- No computer aided or copy-machine poster entries.
- **A completed entry form must be attached to the back upper right corner of each poster submitted.**
- Reproducibility of the poster will be a factor in the judges' decisions, so use good lettering and bright, high contrast colors.
- **Entries MUST be received by May 1, 2020**, and may be turned in at any Amarillo Public Library or the second floor of the Simms Municipal Building.
- Judge's decisions are final. Prizes cannot be redeemed for money.

General Rules & Information:

- The contest theme is “Every Drop Counts.”
- Entry forms can be found online at water.amarillo.gov or at any Amarillo Public Library location.
- The poster should be artistic, positive in approach, and focus on water conservation.
- Posters will be judged on quality of design, creativity, originality, content, and reproducibility.
- Poster must be at least 11 x 8.5 inches, but not larger than 17 x 11 inches and must be in landscape (horizontal) layout. (It reproduces better for the calendar.)
- Poster may be submitted on paper or poster board.
- A completed entry form must be attached to the back upper right corner of each poster submitted.
- Must be student’s **original** artwork.
- Reproducibility of the poster will be a factor in the judges’ decisions, so use good lettering, bright and high contrast colors.
- No signatures on posters. No syndicated, copyrighted, or clipart images.
- No computer aided or copy-machine poster entries.
- Entries can be turned in at any Amarillo Public Library location or the second floor of the Simms Municipal Building at 808 S. Buchanan.
- Entries must be received by **May 1st**.
