# ANIMAL MANAGEMENT & WELFARE (1710) FUNCTIONS, GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

### **FUNCTION**

The Animal Management & Welfare Department promotes the health and safety of the community through enforcement and shelter services for stray, lost animals, or unwanted animals in Amarillo. The Department provides a facility for such animals and leases space to the Amarillo Panhandle Humane Society. Animal Management & Welfare enforces City ordinances and State laws pertaining to animals. The Department investigates cases of rabies and other zoonotic diseases. The Department provides public education and programs to encourage adoptions, responsible pet ownership, proper care of animals, and spay/neutering for population control.

#### **GOALS**

The Department of Animal Management & Welfare strives to reduce health hazards from stray animals and unsanitary animal conditions in the community. To reduce cases of animal cruelty, animal bites and possible rabies infections and increase owner reclaims of lost pets, promote adoptions and to reduce euthanasia. To maintain professional standards and improve training of Animal Management Officers and shelter staff. To Continue improving the environment and conditions of the shelter facilities and the animals housed. To hold regular vaccination and microchipping clinics accessible for those in need.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- ★ Enhanced enforcement of existing laws and codes.
- ★ Enhancement of existing laws and codes to improve their effectiveness.
- Encourage citizens to spay/neuter and vaccinate their animals
- ★ Increase community outreach programs in collaboration with the Amarillo Panhandle Humane Society and other community partners.
- ★ Increase the live release rate at the shelter.

### **ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

In FY2014-15, the Department continues to move forward through physical, operational, and philosophical changes. The intake process continues to improve to now include canine vaccinations (Bordetella, distemper, and parvo) and de-worming upon entering the facility to maintain biosecurity. Reviews and changes to the Municipal Code continue to be made which will enhance compliance activity. The Department now has a formal SOP (Standard Operating Procedure) manual and new training manuals for staff members. The Department continues to review all levels and aspects of operation and is making appropriate adjustments as needed. Shelter sanitation has been on the forefront and new cleaning systems have been implemented which has drastically reduced illness within the facility. Major Facility improvements continue and include: Two positive air pressure fans are being installed in each animal building with each fan supplying up to 3,500 cubic feet of fresh air. Exterior canine kennels and walkways are receiving an elastomeric membrane to the walls which will facilitate a sanitary and easily cleanable surface. Feline improvements have been focused to reduce stress to keep the health of the felines high to increase adoptability. Feline kennels are receiving insulation to help reduce sounds from transferring from one kennel to the next, visual barriers to allow the cats a place to hide behind, specialized cat boxes for the highly fractious cats, and classical music to help facilitate a soothing environment. The Animal Management & Welfare Department continues to pursue high professional standards for officers and staff through Amarillo College, the Texas Animal Control Association, and the National Animal Control Association. Public Awareness through outreach which include Department staff participating with nonprofit organizations to continue to promote advocacy for animals, including quarterly vaccination and microchipping clinics. Fostering stronger community partnerships to improve animal care, expanding adoptions, fostering programs, as well as diversion programs to prevent animals from entering the facility. Department performance is improving with more animals being returned to owners in the field preventing them from entering the facility, more owners are coming to reclaim their animals from the facility, and adoptions through local humane groups have increased.
