- Bus shelter + streetscape improvements in design (4-5 pending cost)
- Historic North Heights sign toppers unveiled July 22

Community Projects

- Community-Building Grant for Elderly Lawn Care Initiative
- North Heights Rezoning Committee actively working on neighborhood-wide rezoning recommendations

Redevelopment/Other

- The Commons at St. Anthony's (awarded housing tax credits July 23)
- North Heights Linen Service LLC construction underway
