 - \$3MM in overall incentive (\$300,000 per year for 10 years)
 - \$9MM in guaranteed AQHA payroll over the 10 year period
 - Guaranteed to remain in Amarillo for at least 10 years.

AEDC will provide AQHA \$3,000,000 for the retention of its International Headquarters for at least 10 years with a guaranteed payroll of no less than \$9,000,000 annually. These funds will be paid out over ten years and will be based on a ten year performance term.

Twenty eight deep security licenses will provide anti-virus and malware protection for VM hosts operating the City's server infrastructure. For physical and virtual desktop computers, IT continues to transition from Trend Micro to a Microsoft product as an equivalent alternative to reduce costs. The 650 Smart Protect licenses are still needed for the upcoming year but reflect a net reduction of 1350 licenses since the product was first deployed in 2019.

F. Mayor Nelson presented an item for discussion and consideration for Amarillo Economic Development Corporation to purchase approximately 171 acres of land located at North Eastern Street and Loop 335 for the purchase price of \$855,000.00 plus closing costs and related expenses.

Motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Powell to approve the purchase of this

property, second by Councilmember Smith.

Voting AYE were Mayor Nelson, Councilmembers Stanley, Powell, Sauer and Smith; voting NO were none; the motion carried by a 5:0 vote of the Council.

H. Mayor Nelson presented a resolution for the Barrio Neighborhood South East 10th Avenue Streetscape Improvement Project to apply for a TxDOT Transportation Alternatives Set Aside Grant.

Mayor Pro Tem Powell made the motion to approve the resolution, second by Councilmember Sauer.

The SE 10th Avenue Streetscape Improvement Project is one of the high priority projects for the Barrio Neighborhood Plan implementation. It will widen sidewalks, install pedestrian and ADA amenities and enhance transit stops on the north and south side of SE 10th Avenue, a five land TxDOT road (Loop 395) between Garfield Street and Ross Street. A private plaza and alley improvements are also planned in coordination with the streetscape project.

The grant program requires a public entity as the project sponsor. The sponsor is responsible for the development and construction management of the project as well as the local match. The required match is 20% and is expected to be between \$330,000 and \$400,000. If awarded, the BNPC will utilize their 2016 Prop #1 bond allocation for the match and the additional administrative costs required of the program.

I. Mayor Nelson presented a resolution for the approval of the Settlement Agreement between the Cities of Amarillo, Lubbock, Dalhart, and Channing (The "Cities" or "ALDC" and Atmos Energy Corporation ("ATMOS or "The Company") regarding Atmos Energy's application and request to increase rates filed with the City of September 30, 2020.

Motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Powell to adopt the resolution, second by Councilmember Smith.

On about September 30, 2020 Atmos Energy Corporation ("Atmos" or "Company") filed a Statement of Intent to increase rates within the incorporated areas of the cities of Amarillo, Lubbock, Dalhart and Channing (collectively the "Cities" or "ALDC") in its West Texas Division. Atmos sought an increase of approximately \$8.3 million in revenue, equating to an increase in annual revenue of about 7.7% including the cost of gas and approximately 10.8% excluding the cost of gas. Atmos proposed an effective date of November 4, 2020, for its increased rates.

Atmos's application represents its first general rate case since 2012 (GUD No.10174). Prior to this filing Atmos sought annual increases in rates pursuant to the Gas Reliability Infrastructure Program ("GRIP"). However, Atmos has filed the maximum number of GRIP filings it is authorized to make pursuant to state law, and thus, to the extent Atmos seeks to increase its rates, it must do so in a general rate case.

This Item provides for TxDOT to perform additional mowing of Interstate Highway right-of-way within the City limits in addition to the mowing scheduled as part of TxDOT annual operations. The City will be responsible for \$25,428.00 per additional mowing cycle that is requested by the City and performed by TxDOT.

Agenda Item Summary

This item improves community appearance and improves public safety and health.

This item was initially discussed during community appearance meetings and Council Work Session in April of 2017. The initial agreement for supplemental and additional mowings of right-of-way on IH-40 and IH-27 within the city limits was approved by Council on July 18, 2017 (Item No. 5) in an amount not to exceed \$87,912.42 (TxDOT CSJ# 6290-44-001). The original agreement expired on 7/31/18.

Following the expiration of the original agreement, the City entered into a new agreement with TxDOT for the supplemental and additional mowings (TxDOT CSJ# 6328-67-001) which covered calendar year 2019.

Based on the unforeseen impacts of COVID, the City did not update the agreement for 2020.

The proposed agreement (TxDOT CSJ# 6358-25-001) will increase the City's cost by \$6,151.62 annually while providing the same number of supplemental mowings (3). Each mowing costs \$24,478.54 for a total of \$82,435.62 for 3 supplemental mowings. The number and frequency of the mowing is determined by the TxDOT District Engineer.

General Mowing Schedule between TxDOT and the City of Amarillo has been as follows:

Terms of the agreement:

- April TxDOT to mow IH-40 and IH-27 with in-house forces if needed.
- May, July, and September TxDOT Contractor to mow IH-40 and IH-27 paid by the COA
- June, August, and October TxDOT Contractor to mow IH-40 and IH-27 paid by TxDOT.

Total Number of mowings completed by TxDOT in 2018: 3 (June, August, September) with 1 mow scheduled for after the first freeze (October)

WHEREAS, Texas Transportation Commission Minute Order Number <u>115706</u> authorizes the State to undertake and complete a highway improvement generally described as **Mowing Highway Right of Way**; and,

WHEREAS, the Local Government has requested that the State allow the Local Government to participate in said improvement by funding that portion of the improvement described as **Mowing Highway Right of Way**: called the "Project"; and,

WHEREAS, the State has determined that such participation is in the best interest of the citizens of the State;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto, to be by them respectively kept and performed as hereinafter set forth, the State and the Local Government do agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. Time Period Covered

The period of this Local Project Advance Funding Agreement (LPAFA) is as stated in the Master Agreement Governing Local Transportation Project Advance Funding Agreements (MAFA), without exception.

2. Project Funding and Work Responsibilities

The State will authorize the performance of only those Project items of work which the Local Government has requested and has agreed to pay for as described in Attachment A, Payment Provision and Work Responsibilities which is attached to and made a part of this contract. In

3. Payment of Funds

4. Right of Access

If the Local Government is the owner of any part of the Project site, the Local Government shall permit the State or its authorized representative access to the site to perform any activities required to execute the work.

5. Adjustments Outside the Project Site

The Local Government will provide for all necessary right of way and utility adjustments needed for performance of the work on sites not owned or to be acquired by the State.

6. Responsibilities of the Parties

Responsibilities of the Parties will be under the conditions as provided for in the MAFA, without exception.

7. Document and Information Exchange

The Local Government agrees to electronically deliver to the State all general notes, specifications, contract provision requirements and related documentation in a Microsoft® Word or similar document. If requested by the State, the Local Government will use the State's document template. The Local Government shall also provide a detailed construction time estimate including types of activities and month in the format required by the State. This requirement applies whether the local entity creates the documents with its own forces or by hiring a consultant or professional provider. At the request of the State, the Local Government shall submit any information required by the State in the format directed by the State.

8. Inspection and Conduct of Work

Unless otherwise specifically stated in Attachment A, Payment Provision and Work Responsibilities, to this contract, the State will supervise and inspect all work performed hereunder and provide such engineering inspection and testing services as may be required to ensure that the Project is accomplished in accordance with the approved plans and specifications. All correspondence and instructions to the contractor performing the work will be the sole responsibility of the State. 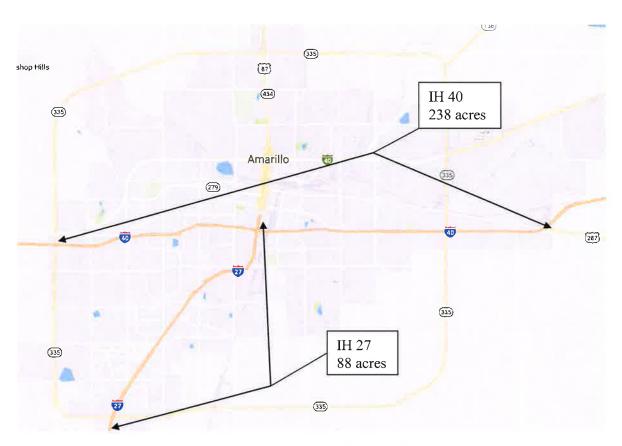

CONSIDER RESOLUTION APPROVING A CHANGE IN ATMOS ENERGY CORPORATION, WEST TEXAS DIVISION'S ("ATMOS") RATES AS A RESULT OF THE REDUCTION IN THE FEDERAL INCOME TAX RATE FROM 35% TO 21%; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

Agenda Item Summary

Effective January 1, 2018 the U.S. Congress changed the federal-income-tax ("FIT") laws, by among other things, reducing the corporate tax rate from 35% to 21%.

The effect of the reduction in the federal tax rate is to reduce the value of the deferred taxes used to reduce rate base in the recent Amarillo, Lubbock, Dalhart and Channing ("ALDC") Settlement Agreement. Internal Revenue Service regulations require Atmos Energy Corp.'s West Texas Division (the "West Texas Division") to reduce its rates on a normalized basis in order to provide cost of service customers with the benefit of the reduction in the value of the deferred taxes. The reduction in the value of the deferred taxes is commonly referred to as "Excess Deferred Taxes." Atmos contends that to avoid violation of the IRS's "normalization" rules, it is required to reduce its rates to recognize the reduction in the value of its reduction in the value of its deferred-tax balance.

ATMOS' REQUEST:

Atmos – West Texas Division ("Atmos" or "Atmos Energy") seeks to pass through to ratepayers the effect of the reduction in the FIT tax rate on its Excess Deferred Taxes for service provided on and after June 1, 2021. To that end, the Utilities Code § 104.111 allows for a utility like Atmos to reduce its rates without the need to file a full-blown cost-of-service study and allows for administrative approval of the decrease by the appropriate regulatory authority.

The City, under Utilities Code § 103.001 is the appropriate regulatory authority for Atmos' rates within the City.

Atmos notes that the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") recently clarified that the amortization period for the refund of Atmos Energy's Deferred Taxes is reduced from 25 years to 5 years. However, due to the timing of the IRS's guidance in 2020 and the filing of the Atmos Energy's recent application to increase rates (that is, its 2020 general rate case, also known as its "statement of intent"), Atmos Energy was unable to include the accelerated amortization/refund period, which the IRS's guidance clarified, in its general rate case. Thus, Atmos Energy's application under Utilities Code § 104.111 reflects the impact of accelerating the amortization period from 25 years to 5 years related to certain of its Deferred Taxes.



Atmos seeks administrative approval of a reduction in its rates as expeditiously as possible, to begin passing through to ratepayers the reduction in Atmos Energy's rates. The reduction in Atmos revenues is about \$1.97 million in the Cities of Amarillo, Channing, and Dalhart.

To effectuate the reduction of \$1.97 million, Atmos Energy will reduce each customer's monthly bill by the amount shown below by customer Rate Schedule for each month for a 60-month period or until Atmos Energy's next general rate it files with the City.

WHEREAS, the City of Amarillo, Texas ("City") is a regulatory authority under the Gas Utility Regulatory Act ("GURA"), and under § 103.001 of GURA has exclusive original jurisdiction over Atmos Energy Corporation – West Texas Division ("Atmos" or "Atmos Energy") rates, operations, and service of a gas utility within the municipality; and

WHEREAS, Atmos Energy seeks to pass through to ratepayers the effect of the reduction in the federal tax rate on its Excess Deferred Taxes for service provided on and after June 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, Utilities Code § 104.111 allows for a utility like Atmos to reduce its rates without the need to file a full-blown cost-of-service study and allows for administrative approval of the decrease by the appropriate regulatory authority; and

WHEREAS, the City recently approved an increase in Atmos Energy's rates; and

WHEREAS, even though the corporate tax rate on federal income included in Atmos' current rates and approved in Atmos Energy's recent general rate case was based on a federal-income-tax rate of 21%; and

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") clarified that the amortization period for the refund of Atmos Energy's Deferred Taxes is reduced from 25 years to 5 years, but due to the timing of the IRS's guidance in 2020 and the filing of the Atmos Energy's recent application to increase rates (that is, its 2020 general rate case), Atmos Energy was unable to include the accelerated amortization/refund period, in its general rate case; and

WHEREAS, Atmos Energy's application under Utilities Code § 104.111 reflects the impact of accelerating the amortization period from 25 years to 5 years related to certain of its Deferred Taxes.; and

WHEREAS, accordingly, Atmos seeks administrative approval under Utilities Code § 104.111 to decrease its rates by approximately \$1.97 million; and

WHEREAS, Atmos' proposed decrease in rates comprises a change in rates thus invoking GURA § 103.022, which requires Atmos to reimburse the City's reasonable expenses associated with reviewing Atmos' proposal to change rates; and

WHEREAS, the City's Special Counsel and consultants engaged to review Atmos' calculation and the effect the reduction in the corporate federal-income-tax rate from 35%

to 21% has on Atmos' Deferred Taxes, have confirmed that Atmos' calculation of the reduction in Atmos' revenue is mathematically accurate; and

WHEREAS, by approving the reduction in Atmos' rates, and consenting to the reduction in Atmos' rates, the City, in future proceedings or in other jurisdictions, is under no obligation to take the same positions with regard to the methodology resulting in a reduction in rates, as the methodology underlying the reduction proposed by Atmos, nor shall the City's approval of the reduction in Atmos' rates or its consent to the reduction in Atmos' rates, be used against City in any future proceeding with respect to different positions the City may take with regard to setting Atmos' rates.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AMARILLO, TEXAS THAT:

Section 1. The findings set forth in this Resolution are hereby in all things approved and incorporated herein.

Section 2. Atmos shall submit to the City within fourteen days from the effective date of this Resolution, amended tariffs reflecting the reduction in revenue noted above, and Atmos Energy shall reduce each customer's monthly bill by the amount shown below by customer Rate Schedule for each month for a 60-month period or until Atmos Energy's next general rate case it files with the City for service provided on and after June 1, 2021:

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Amarillo, Texas (the "City"), has determined that certificates of obligation (the "Certificates") should be issued under and pursuant to the provisions of Texas Local Government Code, Subchapter C of Chapter 271, as amended, and in one or more series for the purpose of paying contractual obligations to be incurred for (i) the acquisition, construction, renovation, improvement and equipment of one or more buildings to be used as a municipal government complex and related parking lot improvements, including the acquisition of any land needed therefor and the demolition of any existing structures on sites needed for the municipal government complex and parking lot improvements, (ii) the demolition of the existing City Hall and (iii) professional services rendered in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, prior to the issuance of such Certificates, the City Council is required to publish notice of its intention to issue the same in a newspaper of general circulation in the City, said notice stating (i) the time and place the City Council tentatively proposes to pass the ordinance authorizing the issuance of the Certificates, (ii) the maximum amount proposed to be issued, (iii) the purposes for which the Certificates are to be issued and (iv) the manner in which the City Council proposes to pay the Certificates; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AMARILLO, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice to be published of the City Council's intention to issue certificates of obligation, in one or more series, in the principal amount not to exceed \$35,000,000 for the purpose of paying contractual obligations to be incurred for (i) the acquisition, construction, renovation, improvement and equipment of one or more buildings to be used as a municipal government complex and related parking lot improvements, including the acquisition of any land needed therefor and the demolition of any existing structures on sites needed for the municipal government complex and parking lot improvements, (ii) the demolition of the existing City Hall and (iii) professional services rendered in connection therewith; such certificates to be payable from ad valorem taxes and a limited pledge of the City's Waterworks and Sewer System. The notice hereby approved and authorized to be published shall read substantially in the form and content of **Exhibit A** hereto attached and incorporated herein by reference as a part of this resolution for all purposes.

SECTION 2: The City Secretary shall cause the aforesaid notice to be (i) published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City, once a week for two consecutive weeks, the date of the first publication to be at least forty-six (46) days prior to the date stated therein for the passage of the ordinance authorizing the issuance of the certificates of obligation and (ii) posted continuously on the City's website for at least forty-five (45) days before the date stated therein for the passage of the ordinance authorizing the issuance of the certificates of obligation. By consideration of this Resolution and the publication of the aforesaid notice, the City expresses its intention, but not an obligation, to issue the certificates of obligation.

SECTION 3: It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Resolution is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Resolution, was given, all as required by Texas Government Code, Chapter 551, as amended.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE CITY OF AMARILLO, TEXAS CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION

TAKE NOTICE that the City Council of the City of Amarillo, Texas, shall convene a regular meeting to be held on August 10, 2021 at 1:00 p.m., City Hall, 601 South Buchanan Street, Council Chamber on the Third Floor of the City Hall, Amarillo, Texas. During such meeting, the City Council will consider the passage of one or more ordinances authorizing the issuance of certificates of obligation, in one or more series, in an amount not to exceed THIRTY-FIVE MILLION DOLLARS (\$35,000,000) for the purpose of paying contractual obligations to be incurred for (i) the acquisition, construction, renovation, improvement and equipment of one or more buildings to be used as a municipal government complex and related parking lot improvements, including the acquisition of any land needed therefor and the demolition of any existing structures on sites needed for the municipal government complex and parking lot improvements, (ii) the demolition of the existing City Hall and (iii) professional services rendered in connection therewith; such certificates to be payable from ad valorem taxes and a limited pledge of the City's Waterworks and Sewer System. In accordance with Texas Local Government Code Section 271.049, (i) the current principal amount of all of the City's outstanding public securities secured by and payable from ad valorem taxes is \$191,923,000; (ii) he current combined principal and interest required to pay all of the City's outstanding public securities secured by and payable from ad valorem taxes on time and in full is \$242,759,426; (iii) the estimated combined principal and interest required to pay the certificates of obligation to be authorized on time and in full is \$47,449,696; (iv) the maximum interest rate for the certificates may not exceed the maximum legal interest rate; and (v) the maximum maturity date of the certificates to be authorized is February 15, 2051. The certificates are to be issued, and this notice is given, under and pursuant to the provisions of Texas Local Government Code, Subchapter C of Chapter 271, as amended.
