

#### For Foodies Who Love Pop Culture



Classic Car: The Definitive Visual History Edited by Giles Chapman






#### For Feminist Stargazers

#### For Lovers of History & Horticulture


Seven Flowers and How They Shaped Our World by Jennifer Potter

#### For Social Justice Wonks


The Sum of Us: How Racism Costs Everyone and How We Can Prosper Together by Heather McGhee

#### Bitter Greens by Kate Forsyth



The War Widow by Tara Moss



Murder in the Mystery Suite by Ellery Adams



#### For Lovers of Literary Adventures



#### Behind Closed Doors by B.A. Paris



vivid depictions of nature, emotions, and the human condition, all pulled together by one beautiful boy who lived and died and lived again in the eternity of his father's work.




#### For Spy Thriller Enthusiasts

Need to Know by Karen Cleveland



#### Three Times Lucky by Sheila Turnage



Shortly before Halloween, Lucely and her best friend, Syd, cast a spell that accidentally awakens malicious spirits, wreaking havoc throughout St. Augustine. Together, they must join forces with Syd's grandmother, Babette, and her tubby tabby, Chunk, to fight the haunting head-on and save the town and Lucely's firefly spirits before it's too late.



#### For Heartfelt Poetry Lovers Starfish by Lisa Fipps

Ever since Ellie wore a whale swimsuit and made a big splash at her fifth birthday party, she's been bullied about her weight. 




## For Readers Who Love Lighthearted Coming-of-Age Stories

#### **For Scary Story Lovers**


There's Someone Inside Your House by Stephanie Perkins


## For Lovers of WWII Home Front Fiction
