2B. Experience of Applicant, Subrecipient(s), and Other Partners

1. Describe your organization's (and subrecipient(s) if applicable) experience in effectively utilizing federal funds and performing the activities proposed in the application.

For this project, Community Development will collaborate with Regence Health Network (RHN) Outreach Services. RHN receives federal funds to provide access to healthcare for those individuals experiencing homelessness, with 15 years of experience in homeless outreach. Comm Dev receives state and federal funding for street outreach services and ongoing supportive services for clients after they are housed. Comm Dev's experience in street outreach and supportive housing dates to 2018, when the City of Amarillo identified the need for a program with proven success in many other cities also experiencing high levels of chronic homelessness. Coming Home, a Housing First Model approach to alleviating homelessness, began with local funding and now utilizes federal, state, and local funds. Coming Home is the only area program providing a low-barrier, harm reduction, Housing First Model program that offers ongoing wrap-around services to successfully support clients as they work to achieve greater self-sufficiency. Street outreach (SO) engages unsheltered individuals where they are to connect the client to urgent resources, works through a VAT to assess needs, and when appropriate, pairs the client with a housing program. Coming Home partners with housing programs (ESG Rapid Re-housing, HOME TBRA, and HCV) to provide housing options. The client may decide to engage in ongoing case management and peer support services. Comm Dev has experience with securing match funding for other sources of federal aid (HOME, CoC annual). As a department of the City of Amarillo, the City's finance department provides oversight and final determination in all accounting matters. The City of Amarillo utilizes GAAP and operates in accordance with 2 CFR part 200. The RHN Outreach Clinic is overseen by a director who is a member of the organization's senior leadership team. The clinic's finances are overseen by the organization's finance/accounting department under the supervision of the CFO.

2. Describe your organization's (and subrecipient(s) if applicable) experience in leveraging Federal, State, local and private sector funds.

The City of Amarillo Community Development Department is the long-time recipient of annual entitlement CDBG and HOME funding, annual ESG funds through the state of Texas (TDHCA), CoC funds through the annual CoC competition, and the department is home to the Housing Choice Voucher program for the City of Amarillo. In recent years, Community Development has also secured funding from local, private organizations such as Amarillo Area Foundation and United Way of Amarillo and Canyon, to support the Coming Home project, a Housing First Model approach to address homelessness. Community Development administers these funds for the department and subrecipients within Amarillo. Securing and tracking match, program reporting, draws, and communication with grantors are all responsibilities executed by Community Development. The RHN Outreach Clinic receives funds from HRSA as a federally qualified health center providing access to healthcare for those individuals experiencing homelessness.

As a department of the City of Amarillo, Community Development submits all payment and draw requests to the City’s Accounting Department. Additionally, both the Accounting Department and Community Development maintain separate files to track grant funding and expenditure information. The City of Amarillo utilizes GAAP and operates in accordance with 2 CFR part 200. The RHN Outreach Clinic’s finances are overseen by the organization’s finance and accounting department under the guidance and oversight of the CFO. The organization follows all appropriate accounting practices to include annual, independent audits, and has extensive experience in managing federal/grant funding.

3B. Project Description

1. Provide a description that addresses the entire scope of the proposed project.

This project will increase the size of the street outreach (SO) teams and integrate healthcare professionals (HCP) from RHN as part of the SO team, expanding access to healthcare resources. The focus of the SO team will be to reach any unsheltered individual in the city of Amarillo. In the field, the HCP will provide real time medical assessments, first aid treatment of any minor medical conditions, and most importantly, a beginning link in the chain of establishing with a primary healthcare provider. Connecting the patient with a regular clinic is a priority of the engagement process. Ideally, medical and nursing care should be transitioned from street-based to clinic-based care as soon as feasible for the respective patient. The goal would be to provide every patient with next primary care clinic appointment and encourage appointment adherence through support as appropriate. If a patient is not scheduled, SO can assist patient in scheduling a clinic appointment, or when appropriate/necessary, transport the patient to the clinic for an appointment. SO will also assess the clients for other needs and help connect with relevant services including victim services, the GSRC day shelter, food pantries, employment services and will work with the client to secure necessary identification and/or benefits. SO will connect the client with housing resources in Community Development and partner with a housing navigator (HN) to find the best housing options for the client. The HN will assist with a housing stability plan and work with the client toward finding a unit of the client's choosing. After housing is secured, the client will have the option to engage in ongoing support services through the Coming Home program. The CoC program funds will be used to employ 2 SO case managers, 2 HCP, 1 HN, and 1 case manager for housing support. This project will serve 200 persons through street outreach and 40 persons through housing support services over the term of the grant.

Those experiencing unsheltered homelessness will have the opportunity to choose to engage in outreach services. Clients will not have the precondition of seeking any services (mental health, addiction counseling, etc.) prior to or after being housed.
