



Volunteer Park Clean-Up Checklist

What to bring?

- Family, friends, and other volunteers. Many hands make light work!
- Water.
- Sunscreen.
- Mosquito & Bug Repellent.
- Alcohol Gel/Hand Sanitizer.
- Supplies will be provided, but volunteers are welcome to bring their own.

What to wear?

- Durable, enclosed shoes (no open-toe or sandals).
- Long-sleeve shirts (if sensitive to sun or if sunscreen is not provided).
- Work pants (if mosquito repellent is not provided).
- Hat – helps keep you cool and sun out of your eyes.
- Gloves are provided, but volunteers are welcome to bring your own.

Supplies provided:

- Trash Bags.
- Gloves.
- Safety Vests.
- Yard Grabbers.
- Volunteer Agreements.

Cleaning Tips:

- Never clean what you cannot see.
- Beware of protruding objects from trash and Styrofoam cups
- Never pack trash down inside the bag with your hands

Needles and Syringes:

- Do not touch the needle/syringe with your bare hands, please use grabbers, pliers, or gloves to pick up.
- Do not re-cap the needle. If needle/syringe was already capped, keep cap on.
- Very carefully, preferably an adult, place used needles/syringes in Sharps container, needle down.
- Wash hands or use alcohol gel to clean your hands as soon as possible.
- Keep Sharps container in secure location. This must be disposed as a biohazard waste.
- Notify Park Maintenance crew member on-call, that a Sharps container will need to be disposed of.
- If a volunteer gets a cut or needlestick from a used needle/syringe, seek medical attention as soon as possible.

When complete, please place filled trash bags alongside the curb, and Park Maintenance will pick-up.
