

# **CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS & PROJECTS**

#### 9th Street Trails - Parking Lot

The 9th Street Trails, situated between Quail Creek Drive and Coulter Street on Amarillo's Northwest side, offer mountain biking and jogging trails. Construction began in April of 2024 to install a parking lot that will give bikers easy access to the trails. Construction should be complete this Fall.



### John Stiff Memorial Park - Parking Stop Installation

This parking stop installation will help deter vandalism and donuts in the parking lot outside the softball complex on the south side of John Stiff Memorial Park.



### John Stiff Memorial Park - Dog Park

The dog park is currently in the process of being renovated, receiving irrigation upgrades, concrete work, fencing, seed and replacement canine drinking fountains. The dividing fence will allow Park Maintenance to section off half of the dog park in the future, to address issues without shutting down the entire park. Alternating between these sections will allow grass to grow back and prevent future closures. New patches of concrete have been laid in consideration of mud, which will accumulate near the drinking fountains.

#### **Portable Scoreboards**

Portable scoreboards easily move between various fields, making them an ideal choice for our city league games - held at multiple locations. Typically, being less expensive than fixed scoreboards, portable scoreboards are simple to set up. Their versatility allows them to be used for a range of sports, accommodating different needs without the constraints of а fixture. permanent We have acquired scoreboards that operate using solar panels to avoid problems that arise with chords and outlets.



#### Mary Hazelrigg Shelter

This shelter is situated in Mary Hazelrigg Park, located south of the boulevard and between Washington and Taylor streets. Over time, the shelter fell into disrepair, becoming a safety hazard, as evidenced by the rusted beams and leaking roof. This significantly impacted its usability and aesthetics.

The new shelter provides sturdy support beams, a wide sheet metal roof, and no rusty screws! Residents in the area are already making use of the shelter, especially during the hot summer months in Amarillo. Before and after images are provided.




# **MURALS BY NIARA TORRES**
