## ITEM 1 Approve the minutes of the meeting of March 9, 2017.

Chairman Bentley asked for corrections, deletions or changes to the minutes of March 9, 2017. Motion was made by Mr. Flow, seconded by Mr. Peterson, to approve the minutes as submitted. Motion passed unanimously.

## ITEM 2 Report on Status of Projects:

- a. Downtown Multi-Purpose Events Venue
  Mr. Cowell stated the next step is to relocate an existing storm sewer from the
  street that will be removed. The Local Government Corporation (LGC) continues
  their negotiations in securing a baseball team.
- b. Downtown Parking Garage

  Mr. Cowell advised a certificate of occupancy has been issued for the 750 space parking garage and retail space. The anticipated opening is scheduled for late June after the security system, badge readers, and electronic pay stations are in place. The LGC has a 5 year contract with Bob Garrett for the leasing and managing of the 25,000 sq ft of retail space. Mr. Cowell also mentioned the bond propositions that were approved, included the reconstruction of SE 6<sup>th</sup> and SE 7<sup>th</sup> Avenues.

Chairman Bentley reminded Board members, and those in the audience, the Board can take no action on matters presented or discussed.

No comments were made.

# ITEM 4 Discuss Items for Future Agendas.

Mr. Church advised Nick Ward has resigned from Potter County and the County will be appointing a replacement.

Mr. Peterson inquired if the board could be apprised of gaps where potential streetscape projects would complete the block. Mr. Cowell advised this item would be placed on the future agenda, and would also discuss the Buchanan Street, Polk Street and voter approved propositions, which include some of the streetscape projects.
