QUICK GUIDE for Carbon Monoxide Alarms Informational Bulletin


- Carbon Monoxide (CO) Alarms are required in ALL single family homes when there is an attached garage OR fuel gas appliances are installed.
- A minimum of one (1) CO alarm is required at each sleeping <u>area</u>, outside the bedroom(s). Permanently installed (adhered to wall).
- Carbon Monoxide Alarm may be battery operated. Plug-in devices may be used if mounted permanently to wall.
- Carbon Monoxide alarms should be installed high on wall or ceiling immediately <u>outside</u> of sleeping areas.
- Carbon Monoxide alarms should not be installed in garages or areas of high humidity (bath rooms).
- Avoid placing the CO Alarm near air conditioning vents and filter grills. If no other location is possible try to install the CO Alarm a few feet away from the grills.
- CO Alarms are fairly inexpensive, most of our local suppliers will sell them starting around \$20.00.
- In order to pass the final inspection a Carbon Monoxide Alarm will be installed. It is possible to have a combination smoke and carbon monoxide alarm.

R315.1 Carbon monoxide alarms.

For new construction, an approved carbon monoxide alarm shall be installed <u>outside of each separate</u> <u>sleeping area in the immediate vicinity of the bedrooms</u> in dwelling units within which fuel-fired appliances are installed and in dwelling units that have attached garages.
