In the first year of the Amarillo Ladies City Championship to be open to all Lady Golfers Regardless of Residence, Mattye Mason of Austin and a WTAMU junior to be carded a second round 74 to win the Amarillo Ladies City Championship for her first time with a two day total of two under par 142 on the Mustang layout in Sundays final round at Ross Rogers Golf Complex. Ronna Hopson of Borger, her nearest contender, shot 75 for a two day total of 150 but was 8 shots back after 36 holes. Debbie Holtzclaw was the net division winner with a net two total of 140, Terri Buccola finished second at 144. This event began in 1945 and has been played 69 of the past 72 years.
